

The National Committee in London was accorded full recognition on July 18 by Great Britain and the Dominions—after two years provisional recognition—and Soviet Russia at the same time signed a mutual aid pact recognizing the refugee regime and providing for Czechoslovak military units to serve with the Red Army in the fight against the Germans.

There has been no American minister to Czechoslovakia since the withdrawal of Wilbur J. Carr from Prague in May, 1939. Anthony J. Dregel Biddle, former ambassador to Poland, serves as envoy to the other refugee governments in London and may be designated as minister to Czechoslovakia.





Flying Cadets Learn

Here on the Texas plains, at Randolph and Kelly Fields, Army Air Force flying cadets are learning the primary movements of airplanes in flight before they proceed to tactical training as commissioned officers at the new bases being established throughout the United States.

The old World war "Lufbery circle," named for its originator, Raoul Lufbery, ace of a quarter of a century ago, still is used in

Raoul Lufbery, ace of a quarter of a century ago, still is used in modified form abroad and on training fields.

Clayton Knight, also a World war flier and famed for putting movement into planes with carcoal and paint brush, calls the Lufbery "chasing tails." It's simply a matter of two or more planes flying in the same circle, much like a dog chasing its tall. The circle first was contrived to protect the tails or "blind spot" of grouped airplanes. of grouped sirplanes.
In later years it has been used In later years it has been used to get a flight of airplanes on to small fields. A Lufbery is formed and, one by one, planes "peel off" to land.
