This opinion was expressed to-day by Dr. O. H. Perry Pepper of Philadelphia, chairman of the Committee on Medicine of the National Research Council, in the current issue of War Medicina, published bi-monthly by The American Medical Association co-operating with the council.

Fredicated on Statistics

Dr. Pepper's forecast was predicated on a study of statistics of the Army during the World war and an analysis of present day, knowledge of how more effectively to prevent, diagnose and treat diseases which attacked it.

It is surely justifiable to believe, he said, that few, if any, of the disorders due to lack of sufficient vitamins will occur in the new, well fed Army, Beriberi and pellagra, he predicted, will not reappear, at least under those headings.



Ilm-Hopkins meeting was attended only by interpreters.

German planes made their eighth nightly foray in 11 nights against Moscow and, as on previous nights. Russians said they were forced back. A few planes reached the city and dropped a small number of incendiaries which were extingished after several small fires were started.

It was the second raid against the capital since Hopkins' arrival but the American slept through the air alarm in Spaso house.

Russians claimed victories over sea and land for their planes, saying one flight of dive-bombers attacked two German patrol ships in the Baltic and brought down 15 German planes to eight Soviet losses.

S. A. Lozovsky, vice commissar of foreign affairs, told a preas conference that Hopkins' visit "demonstrates once more the determination of the United States to help all people fighting for their independence against Nazi barbarism."

He said Hopkins' visit and the signing of the Russian-Polish agreement were two events "to the diaadvantage of freedom-loving people."
