Japan Faces Showdown On Program of Expansion Southward as Roosevelt Acts to Embargo Aviation Fuel And Drastically Cut Other Oil Exports on Which Japs Depend.

Washington, Aug. 2.—(AP)—Japan faced a showdown today in her program of expansion southward as President Roosevelt acted to embargo aviation fuel and drastically reduce other oil exports on which Japan depends for more than two-thirds of the gasoline and lubricants that she needs. Since Great Britain and the Dutch East Indies—the only other available major sources—have imposed stringent export control and financial restrictions on oil and other military necessities, petroleum authorities consider that Japan's war machine and industries must now turn principally on hoarded and diminishing oil stocks.

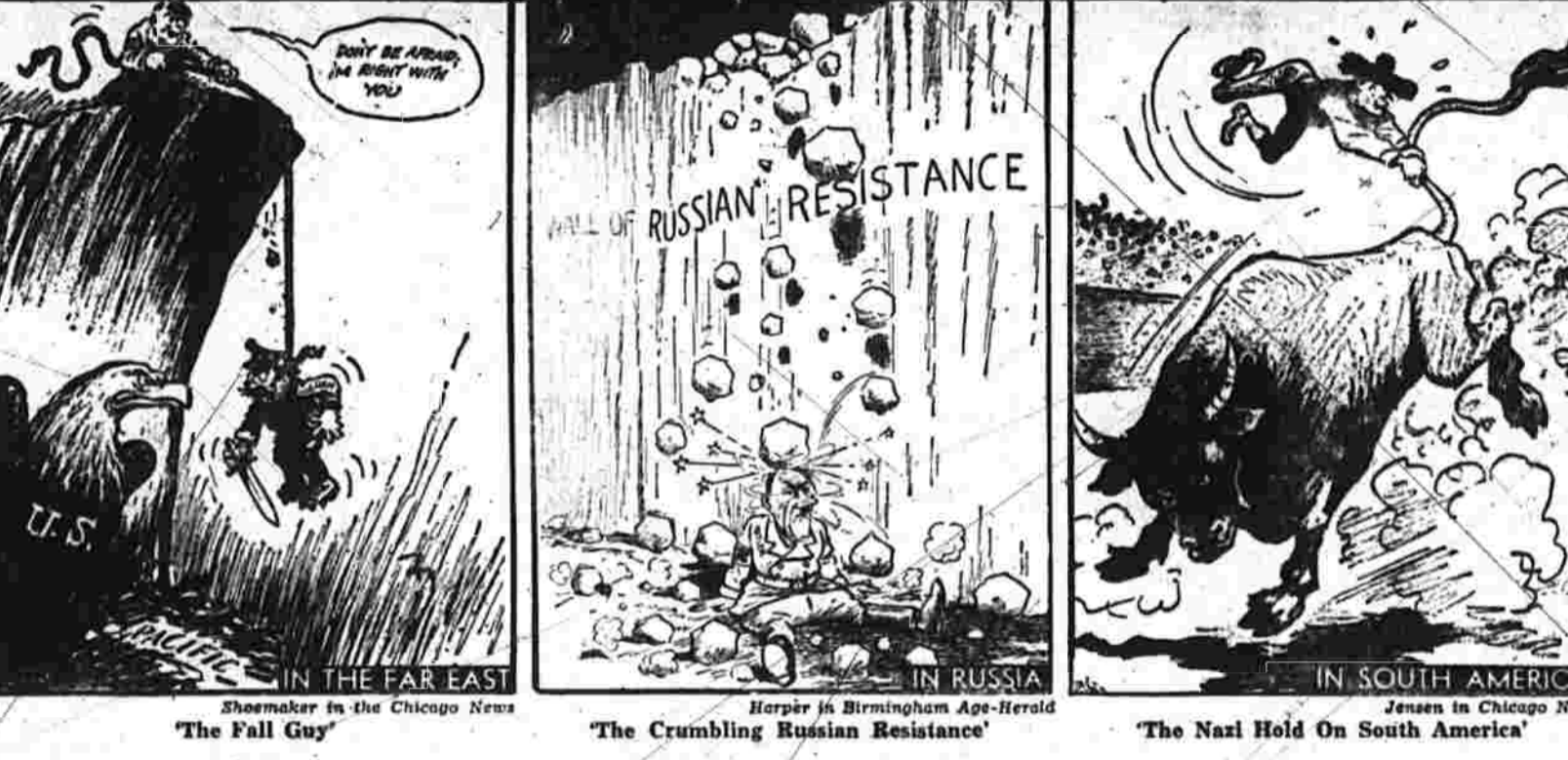

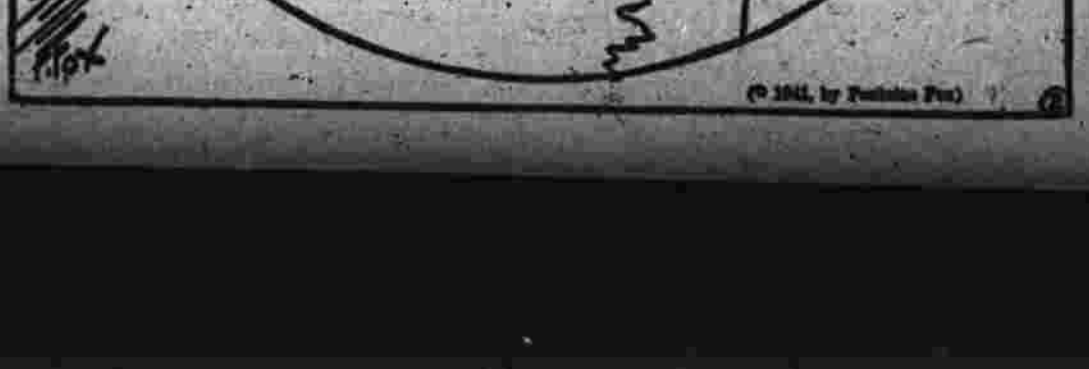
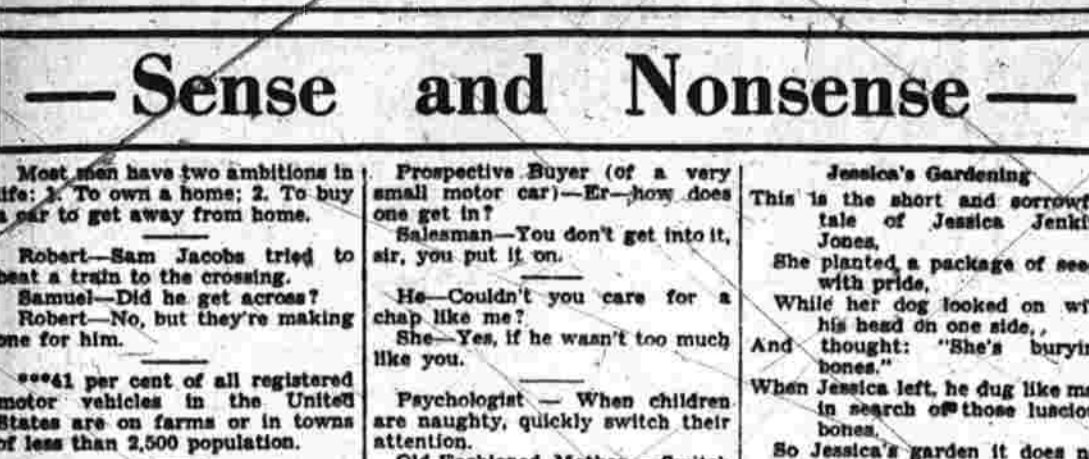

As submitted to the Joint Board there was to be expended for repairs and replacements: High School, \$1,984; Franklin, \$2,090; Barnard, \$2,031; East Side Recreation, \$250; Heating plant, \$2,037; Trade School, \$700; Nathan Hale, \$1,200; Lincoln, \$100; Washington, \$818; Hollister, \$975; Green, \$918; Highland Park, \$116; South, \$200; Keeney, \$239; Bunce, \$156; Robertson, \$207; Buckland, \$124 and general, \$2,464, for a total of \$18,588.
