Advocating a different method, Senator Brown (D., Mich.) said he favored extension of excise taxes to cover additional articles, believing that more money could be raised quicker in that manner.

Luxury Tax Seen

Brown said he thought that Congress eventually would be called upon to impose some sort of luxury tax, possibly in the form of a manufacturers' excise levy which would be effective on purchases made in the higher price brackets but would not pensilize the less affluent buyer.

He and Byrd agreed, however, that the Senate committee was likely to accept the basic principles laid down in the House-approved bill, although Senator Con-

ples laid down in the House-approved bill, although Senator Connally (D., Tex.) said that if additional sources of revenue could be found, he, for one, would favor increasing the total amount to be raised.



The Egyptian government jus tifies its non-belligerency with the contention that it is living up fully to its obligations under the Anglo-Egyptian treaty of 1936. This provides that if Britain en-


