Japs Get Warning Not to Intervene in Thailand Area

Eden Tells Commons Foreign Minister of Japan Warned Action Would 'Give Rise to Most Serious Situation' Between Nations.

London, Aug. 6.—(AP)—Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden disclosed to the House of Commons today that Japan has been warned her intervention in Thailand would "give rise to a most serious situation between Great Britain and Japan." Making his statement in a war review in which he and Maj. Clement Attlee, government leader in Commons, substituted for the absent Prime Minister Churchill, Eden said Ambassador Sir Robert Liddle Craigie had warned the Japanese foreign minister on July 31 of the danger of intervention in Thailand.

He said the British government had noted that the Japanese press was using the same kind of language regarding Thailand as it had employed before the demands were made for bases in Indo-China.

Points to Free Campaign Craigie drew the Japanese foreign minister's attention to his campaign, which has charged the British military preparations are a threat to Japanese interests and that Thailand should come to an understanding with Japan, Eden said.

"Our ambassador pointed out that this kind of thing could only mean that some one in authority in Japan is endeavoring to manufacture a case for Japanese intervention in Thailand."

He added that if a step of this kind is taken, coming in the wake of recent action in Indo-China, it must inevitably give rise to the most serious situation between Great Britain and Japan.

(Almost at the same time that Eden was making this disclosure of the British representation, the United States Secretary of State Cordell Hull made a parallel declaration in Washington that Japan's intentions toward Thailand were of increasing concern to the United States.)

British Bomb Reich Cities

Mannheim, Frankfurt, Karlsruhe Targets; Supply Vessel Also Hit.

London, Aug. 6.—(AP)—Dogged by bad flying weather on his way to and from western Germany, a large force of British bombers found clear skies over Mannheim, Frankfurt and Karlsruhe last night and unloaded explosives with conspicuous success, the Air Ministry said today.

Other bombers raided Aachen and cleared during the night and a Besenfurt plane of the coastal command was credited with scoring a pair of direct hits on a German supply ship at Nantes.

Reds Master Of Air Above Moscow Yet

Aviation Authority Reports 'Surprising Number' of Women Pilots in Soviet Air Force.

Moscow, Aug. 6.—(AP)—The Red Army today declared the German offensive in the Ukraine with counter-attacks such as those which threw back the Nazis in the central sector last week. While mobile fighting raged at places along a 350-mile front from the Smolensk region west of Moscow to Bel Tserkov, south of Kiev, firmly entrenched Russians were reported turning back successive assaults waves of German infantry in the northwest—in Estonia and south of Leningrad.

The Russians reported today that a transport ship—presumably German—had been sunk in the Baltic Sea by a Soviet submarine, as fighting flared with renewed intensity along the entire Russian-German battlefield.

Gas Rationing Plan Is Ready

New York State Submits Program to Federal Officials as Model.

New York, Aug. 6.—(AP)—A gasoline rationing plan for New York state has been drawn up for possible use beginning in September and has been submitted to Federal officials as a model for other eastern states.

The plan, suggesting a limit of 15 gallons a week for pleasure car owners to conserve eastern gasoline supplies already threatened by lack of tanker transportation, was devised by State Motor Vehicle Commissioner Carroll E. Mealey at the request of Secretary of the Interior Harold I. Ickes.

Mealey was in Washington for a conference with Ickes today and it was understood that similar officials from other seaboard states likewise were discussing rationing with the petroleum coordinator.

The rationing system would be supervised by Mealey and county clerks in each affected county in the eastern half of the state. Eastern rationing policy and details were proclaimed by Ickes.

Secretary Ickes' suggestion that New York devise a model plan was delivered to Mealey through Gov. Herbert H. Lehman.

Jump in Price For Stockings Not Justified

Henderson Asserts Any Increase Now Could Be Generally Characterized as Profiteering.

Washington, Aug. 6.—(AP)—Price Administrator Henderson told Congress today that any increase in the price of silk stockings now could be "generally characterized as profiteering."

Resuming his testimony before the House Banking Committee on the administration's price control bill, Henderson declared that the recent stoppage of silk production would not justify any increase in the price of silk stockings on the shelves of the retailers.

Moscow Again Nazis' Target

Night Raiders Shower Tons of Explosives On Russian Capital.

Berlin, Aug. 6.—(AP)—German night raiders again pounded Moscow last night, showering the Russian capital with "many tons of explosives and tons of thousands of incendiaries," the German high command declared today.

Direct hits were scored on airplane factories and were spread among Russian supply plants in the capital, the daily war bulletin from Adolf Hitler's headquarters asserted.

A 4,000-ton freighter was sunk off the British coast by air attack, another was damaged and parts and air bases were attacked, it said.

Eight Planes Downed In British raids on Germany, eight British planes were said to have been downed. Five were shot down, according to press reports.

John Chartier Is Dead at 69

John Chartier, considered a top light featherweight boxer in 1907, when he fought on the preliminary card at the Terry McGovern-Young Coliseum fight in Hartford on Thanksgiving afternoon in that year, died at the Manchester Memorial hospital this morning at 7 o'clock.
