

Morgenthau Urges Congress Put Tax On Millions More

Would Levy on Persons With Small Incomes By Cutting Personal Exemptions and Stiffen Other Taxes on Married, Companies.

Washington, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Advocating an "all-out tax program for defense," Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau asked Congress today to tax millions of additional persons with small incomes by cutting personal income tax exemptions and to stiffen other taxes on married couples, corporations and others. He told the Senate Finance Committee that the revenue from the House-approved tax bill should be increased from its present \$3,246,200,000 to "at least" \$3,500,000,000. He hinted strongly he would like much more.

Under questioning, Morgenthau estimated it would be necessary to raise at least \$2,000,000,000 more than is expected to be provided by the pending bill if the government is to pay two-thirds of its operating cost.

12 Billion Deficit Seen

John L. Sullivan, assistant Treasury secretary, testified that anticipated expenditures for this fiscal year were \$22,000,000,000 with an estimated deficit of about \$12,000,000,000. To meet two-thirds of the cost, at that rate, he said, estimated revenues would need to be boosted by about \$2,000,000,000, including the amounts contained in the pending bill.

The question arose when Sen. Vandenberg (R-Mich.) recalled that Morgenthau had said last April it was "doubtful what would happen to the public credit" if the government did not attain a basis of two-thirds of its needs by one-third borrowing to meet its expenditures.

Reading a 15-page statement, the Treasury head asked a dozen changes to boost the yield of the tax bill, but said his proposed new taxes on "millions of people with low incomes" should not be attempted "unless we reach to the places where ability to pay is increasing."

He explained that this applied to married couples and corporations, particularly.

No Figures Given

Morgenthau gave no figures on how deeply he thought personal exemptions should be cut. Only last year, however, the exemption for heads of families was cut from \$2,000 to \$1,500. Suggestions for single persons were reduced from \$1,800 to \$1,500. Suggestions have been heard recently that the exemption for married couples be \$1,000 for single persons.

Hopson Signs Over Fortune Agreement Gives Assets To Associated System And to Pay Taxes.

New York, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Howard C. Hopson, utility magnate who once dominated the Great Associated Gas and Electric System, has signed in his Federal prison cell, an agreement to turn over to the system and to the Federal and New York state governments a major part of his remaining fortune of about \$5,000,000.

An agreement among the "Hopson interests" which included some members of his family and some of his corporations, the principal associated gas companies and the Federal and state governments was filed in Federal district court here.

The agreement, to become effective, must be approved by Judge Vincent L. Leibel, who has jurisdiction over reorganization of the Associated System, and by the state government. The agreement promises offered by Hopson, the compromise offered on Federal taxes was accepted yesterday at Washington.

Japanese See Ring as Easy One to Snap

Military, Political and Economic Encirclement Should Be Hit in 'German Fashion.'

Tokyo, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The Japanese declared today that their empire is ringed by the military, political and economic power of the United States, Britain, China and the Netherlands but that it would be easy to break the economic encirclement if Japan adopts "the German fashion."

There was nothing specific in the latter comment to indicate that more than a bloodless power struggle was suggested. It came from one of Japan's most authoritative military experts, Lieut. Cmdr. Tada Ichimaru. Writing in the newspaper Hochi, he said:

"Machindao, China, Indo-China and the Philippines have joined the co-prosperity sphere. Now we can draw on Indo-China and Thailand for iron, coal and rice and other food."

"Getting the (Netherlands) Indian oil and Malay rubber is a bit difficult, but should be a cinch if we tackle the problem after the German fashion."

Arriving in the darkened room the local Fascist headquarters where Bruno lay in state with two companions who died in an air crash yesterday, Mussolini patently long beside the open casket.

Moscow, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Sailors from the Red Navy have been put into action on land duty with the Red Army on the Baltic front and have recaptured a village, a dispatch from the Baltic fleet reported tonight. The dispatch said a Naval force marched 50 miles to enter land operations and retook the German-held village after a three-day battle against superior numbers, finally storming it in a bayonet charge.

Nazi Press Says Bases Are Sought

Red Air Force Bombs Berlin During Night

British Attack Essen, Dortmund and Hamm; Widespread Fires Set In Raid on 3 Cities.

London, Aug. 8.—(AP)—A reliable source with Soviet contacts said today he had been informed that the Red Air Force attacked Berlin last night.

This source gave no details. Earlier the German high command said that six and one-half weeks of war had cost the Germans more than 1,500,000 men, but their own losses at 600,000 dead, wounded and missing and declared the Nazi blitzkrieg a complete failure.

Capture Much Material

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Denial Seen Trying to Injunct New, Intriguing Note That Russians Will Make Attacks.

Berlin, Aug. 8.—(AP)—This capital was raided by the air for the 80th time last night, by unofficial count, but the German high command, aside from an implication that the raiders were British, did not identify the "individual planes" which bombed Berlin.

The R. A. F. claims to have destroyed the morale of the German people, who, the Russians claim, have been rendered unable to fight. The Russian Air Force, which the Germans had captured as no longer an offensive threat, had bombed Berlin and had flown over 600 miles to the target.

It also was remotely possible that members of the R. A. F. had exceeded their orders by attacking Berlin. Poles or Czechs in the R. A. F. might be liable to such overstepping. The bombing of Berlin might also have been a British mistake.

Declares Bombers British

An authorized German spokesman declared that the bombers were "undoubtedly British" and added that "the British (through their agents) are doubtless trying to inject a new, intriguing note into the war by forcing the Russians to start visiting us."

"But anyone knowing the Russian military situation appreciates this," he said.

Two communiques touched on this said, a special report issued in early morning said:

"Weak enemy forces flew into western Germany last night. Only a few planes succeeded in advancing as far as Berlin. The limited number of explosives dropped caused minor damage to buildings, killing several civilians."
