



Stimson to Tell Soldiers Reason for Longer Duty On Highway Curve.

New York, Aug. 13-(F)-A two-status over NBC-Red Sunday network broadcast is being set up 9:30 p. m.

network broadcast is being set up at 8:30 Taursday night for a 25-minute talk by Secretary of War Stimson to the men in America's new Army.

Speaking from Washington, he is to explain why Congress was asked to extend the period of mill-tary training beyond the original year. Loudspeaker systems in recreation and mess halls in Army posts all over the country will carry his words to the soldiers.

The networks handling the address will be NBC-Blue and MBS, with a relay via short wave.
