

Germans Aver Reds Retreating Farther; Set Losses at 25,000

Powerful Red Counter-Attacks on Central and Northern Fronts in Ukraine Reported as Admission Made of Loss of Nikolaev and Krivoi Rog to Nazis.

Moscow, Aug. 18.—(AP)—Powerful Red Army counter-attacks costing the Germans at least 25,000 men on the central and northern Ukrainian front were reported today by the Russians while acknowledging the loss in the south of their big shipbuilding port of Nikolaev and the mining center of Krivoi Rog. In addition the Russians declared their troops had crippled at least three other divisions which were said to have been beaten back after losses of 50 to 80 per cent of their normal fighting strength of 45,500 men.

Thus the Red Army apparently was hitting back full strength against the northern drive of the long wedge the Germans were driving relentlessly east—Odesa and east toward the hydro-electric power center of Dnepropetrovsk at the Dnieper river bend.

Police Play Vital Part In Safety

Buffalo, N. Y., Aug. 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt told the 48th annual International Police conference today "the internal security of the United States is dependent in large part on the zeal and prudence" of law enforcement officers.

In a letter of greeting to Maj. Ernest W. Brown, head of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the President said: "This is the critical period of the nation's history the functions of which are being performed by you."

Bombers Blast Bremen, Nazis Industry Area

Large-Scale Daylight Offensive Indicated Today by Big Formation Over Channel.

London, Aug. 18.—(AP)—British bombers which pounded Germany and occupied France by day and night during the week-end were reported today to have concentrated last night on Bremen and the important industrial area around Duisburg on the Rhine.

Indicating a large-scale daylight offensive against some continental objective, a big formation of R. A. F. planes roared high over the channel from the southeast coast this afternoon.
