



Without Notice Income Group Homes in \$3,000-\$4,500 Bracket Lead

Building Program, Report Shows Consistent effort on the part of the Federal Housing Administration to bring home ownership within the reach of modest-income families has resulted in new trends in the housing field toward that end.

Substantiating the FHA's claims that the whole emphasis of the building industry is changing is a recent report made by the National Association of Real Estate Boards declaring that the \$3,000-\$4,500 house has become the No. 1 house on America's home-building program.

Homes in this bracket represent "the lion's share of to-day's construction in 48 per cent of the reporting cities, and in the average city it makes up 50 per cent of the current home-building program," according to the report. FHA Brings Change
Until the advent of the FHA the tendency was widespread to build far too many houses for the people who
could pay top prices and far too few for the little fellow who was looking for a low-cost house. Too many builders erroneously thought if a development of expensive homes had succeeded for a competitor, similar ventures would

This resulted in overbuilding for one group of the population, under-building for the lower-income families, and eventual destruction of the stability of real estate values. Well over two-thirds of the new single-family homes securing mortgages accepted for FHA insurance during 1940 were valued at from \$3,000 to \$6,000 for house and lot combined. Each year the proportion of homes in this valuation bracket has increased. Conversely, with each valuation group above \$5,000, the proportion of new homes has decreased until in 1940 only 5.6 per cent of the new homes were valued above \$5,000.
