·Has Not Changed Much White Man.

Religion Expressed By Dances Modern civilization has introduced iron bedsteads, canned groceries, velvet to make bright col-ored blouses and rattley pick-up trucks. But even with these few modern-day innovations, the life of the Hopi still is bound up in his religious ceremonies that continue throughout the year. The Hopi expresses his religion through dances held almost every month. secret and takes place in the kiva —an underground chamber.
But on the final day the dancers

Actual solicitation of the gods lasts 16 days. The snake priests and village chiefs go down into the kiva. When they come out, the village crier announces from the house tops that the snake dance is to take place when the moon the state of the snake is to take place when the moon the snake action place in the snake. reaches a certain place in theseky.

cottonwood enclosure on the cerenonial grounds.
On the 16th day, just before sundown, the priests of the Antelope Society appear and take their po-sition by the snakes. Then four or five tribal maidens, in deerskin cornmeal.

A hush suddenly comes over the

village. There is a wild feeling of excitement and anticipation.

The crowd opens and the snake dancers run into the enclosure.

Arms and Cheste Painted Their eyes shine black and bright. Each wears a breech cloth under an embroidered kilt that is held in place by a ceremonial sash. Some dance barefooted, but usually they wear moccasins. Their nude chests and arms are painted in weird designs of lightning, rain and symbols known only to the in front of the Antelope priests.

Then comes the opening signal—four hums, a pause, then four

more.

Like the buzzing of a bumble bee or the serie warning of a rattlesnake, it makes your spine tingle.

The Antelope priests start up the chant that is to accompany

the dance.

Put Snakes In Mouths
The dance begins. Each carrier
puts a snake in his mouth. A puts a snake in his mouth. A favorite grip is about eight inches from the head with the tail and body dangling and squirming down in front. Often, however, a carrier may dance with a snake held directly in its middle.

Beside each carrier dances a retriever. The retriever holds two features in his right hand, chop stick fashion. He rests his left stick Inshion. He rests his left hand on the carrier's shoulder, As they dance together the retriever entertains the smake by stroking its neck and head with the feath-ers. This seems to keep it from striking. If the snake should clutch at the carrier's cheek or neck, the retriever jerks the snake's head

retriever jerks the snake's head away.
Each snake must be danced completely around the circle. They neve are put down before the encirlement is completed. If one gets away, the retriever catches it and brings it back to the dancer.

Anywhere from 15 to 25 teams of two take part in the dance.

Sprinkle Comment on Heads
As each snake is carried past the girls, they sprinkle comment on the reptile's head.

After this cycle has been completed, the snake is put down withpleted, the snake is put down with-in the circle of dancers. Here other retrievers herd the snakes and keep them from getting into the

The snakes are then tossed inside the circle and aprinkled again.

Then the dancers gather the snakes—thei. "little brothers"—in aria loads are, run down off the mesa's sides. They carry them to the north, east, south and west.
