Washington, Aug. 20.—(AP)—Capitol Hill heard forecasts today that Harry Hopkins, a special administrator, probably would head the American delegation to the joint meeting in Moscow of United States and British officials with Premier Stalin of Russia. At the same time, there were apparently authentic reports that arrangements had been made to fly American manufactured bombing and fighting planes to the Soviets both by way of Siberia and over an extension of the newly-designated South Atlantic ferry route to the British forces in the Middle East.

Trotzky's Widow Sees Action Necessary to Save Humanity.
Mexico City, Aug. 20—The Soviet union must be defended "to the last drop of blood" to save humanity from complete barbarism.

She still is convinced, however, that the emigrating Jacques Morand, confederate slayer of her husband, acted as a secret agent for the Premier Joseph Stalin, she declared.

Morand, awaiting judgment in a book-lined, comfortably-furnished prison cell, denies this, but the mystery surrounding the motive for his act remains as deep as it did 12 months ago.

His own explanation is that he acted "out of distaste for the man."

"This only ambition was to sweep with Stalin as dictator of Soviet Russia," Morand told an interviewer, who found him tinkering over a model airplane on a workbench installed in his cell by the prison carpenter.

Morand's story is being investigated, according to Mexican legal procedure, by Criminal Court Judge Manuel Rivera Vazquez, who is expected to give a preliminary report soon on his findings in the case.

The report may cast some light on the background of Morand, who says he is a Belgian, born in 1904 in Belgium, Iran (Persia), while his father was Belgian minister there.

Police say he apparently is a former member of the Communist party, and Trotsky's friends say there are other things about Morand they need explaining—the source, for instance, of the funds maintaining him in comparative luxury in prison.

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British Fliers Honor One of Fallen Heroes

Dinner Held by Squadron After Member Shot Down; Many Of Personnel Changed

By Edwin Middleton An R. A. F. Fighter Station in England, Aug. 19.—We drank a toast last night to Dickie Lee, a young pilot who was shot down like a doll and fought like a devil.
