The Farm Security Administra-tion's regional office called on clients throughout the northeast to adopt a "one for one" rule—the feeding of an extra pound of grain to produce an extra pound of milk. The FSA/seeks an increase of there pints of milk a day per cow.

If all dairymen in the northeast adepted the "one for one" feeding rule, the FSA said milk production could be stepped up by approximately 1,581,000,000 quarts a person in London with an extra pint daily.

Farmers also were urged to abandon the practice of selling calves when milk prices are high. Instead, the FSA recommended growing of replacements to in-crease herds.
