No Furloughs Until Xmas

Manchester Soldiers in South Won't Be Able to Come North Till Then.

According to an announcement made by the War Department, former local boys now in training in the Southern states as soldiers will not receive another opportunity to come home until Christmas. In making the statement, it was stated that men due for discharge because of their help being needed at home or due to their being over 28 years of age will also be retained in service until December.

It has definitely been decided to move the 43rd New England Division back to Camp Blanding, Fla., following the maneuvers, it was announced by division headquarters yesterday.
