Reich Forces Storm Key Russian Points; Reds Rout Germans

Counter-Attack on Central Sector Routs Infantry Regiment Nazis Rushed from France Only 10 Days Ago; Black Sea Naval Air Force in Action as Odessa Still Holds Out.

Moscow, Sept. 2.—(AP)—Red Army units counter-attacking on the central sector toward Smolensk have routed a German infantry regiment rushed from France only 10 days ago, it was announced today. The beaten regiment was of the 161st German Division, the Russian daily communicated stated in its supplementary portion. It said the regiment came to the eastern front from the German-occupied French city of Toul, near Nancy and close to the German border.

The Black Sea Naval Air Force was described as in action against land as well as maritime objectives, fighting was reported along the entire front and Odessa still held out under a German-Russian siege.

Bombers Raid Axis Ports

Red Navy bombers raised Axis ports and troop concentrations over the last three days, a communication said, damaging a warship and destroying 83 tanks and more than 50 armored cars.

The strengthened stand of the Red Army from headquarters in Leningrad to the banks of the Dnieper was noted in dispatches.

A captured lieutenant of the 161st division, Ludwig Robert, was quoted by the Soviet Information Bureau as saying that tremendous losses on the eastern front compelled the German high command to withdraw German troops from occupied countries—France, Belgium, Holland and others.

Whole Garrison Sent

"The whole garrison of Toul," he was quoted, "has been sent to the Russian front. At the beginning of the war regular Army contingents were replaced by conscripts and by wounded soldiers who, yet, have not completely recovered. Many of them are still wearing bandages."

During France's participation in the war, Toul was headquarters of the Lafayette squadron, made up of French pilots flying American-built aircraft.

Finn Attacks Support Talk

Back Declaration of Battle Leader War Against Russia (Not Finished)

Helsinki, Sept. 2.—(AP)—Heavy Finnish attacks against Russian troop concentrations and supply bases on the Karelian Isthmus today gave prompt support to the declaration of a Finnish battle leader that the war against Russia "is not finished."

A tremendous explosion during an attack against a Red Army supply base on the Isthmus indicated, according to an official Finnish announcement, that a direct hit had been scored on Soviet ammunition dumps.

Direct hits also were scored, it was said, on Russian communications supply columns and troop concentrations.

These attacks followed a declaration by Lt. Gen. Lemmari Oesch that the war against Russia is not finished, because of his experience as commander of the Finnish army against Russia now that she has regained most of the territory lost in the Russian-Finnish war of 1939-40, but General Oesch brought out old Finnish territorial claims against Russia and said the war would go on.

Common Victory Needed

Finland's largest daily, Helsinki Kokoomus, run by former Foreign Minister Elias Erkko, said today.

"Finland took up arms to defend the eastern frontier, and to secure for herself a peaceful life within a safe frontier. Our people are absolutely unanimous in the belief that only a common victory can guarantee the permanent security of our own victory."

Washington, Sept. 2.—(AP)—The Senate Finance Committee formally approved the record-breaking tax bill today and sent it on to the Senate for debate tomorrow. The bill, biggest in history, was estimated by the Treasury to produce \$5,672,400,000 and nine Soviet tanks and 14 Soviet planes.
