If your house is already built but the attic is unfinished, then you can put Rock. Wool or Balsam Wool Bats over the ceiling or, if the attic floor is laid, nail in the bats between the rafters. You will be doing a worth-while insulation job that will do two things—cut down heat losses in the winter and heat penetration from the outside in
