Duchess Charlotte Gets Passage on U. S. Cruiser ONE of the lesser known refugee monarchs is Grand Duchess

Germany, Belgium and France, was overrun by the Nazis, May 10, 1940. The grand duchess, her consort and six children fied to Paris, May 13, 1940, and arrived in the United States, July 25, 1940, aboard the U.S. cruiser, Trenton.

Grand Duchess Charlotte was bonored philatelically by her government in the 1939 stamp above. She was born in the famed old castle of Berg, Jan. 23, 1896, the second daughter of Grand-Duke Wilhelm and Marie-Anne de Luxembourg. When her father died in 1912, Marie Adelaide, the oldest sister, was placed on the throne. The Imperial German armies occupied the little duchy in 1914.

After the war, the Allies felt the young duchess had not shown enough energy in resisting the Germans. A referendum was called proposing a commercial union with France, and the citizens voted overwhelmingly for it.


