

King Carol of Rumania Flees to Cuba, Mexico DUMANIA'S .notorious playboy

his fellow-refugee monarchs. He was forced to abdicate under internal pressure, not an onrushing German army, and his ultimate destination was Mexico rather cabinet resigned in Rumania and Carol appointed Ion Antonescu prime minister. Antonescu, leader of the Fascist Iron Guard, took following day Carol was forced to abdicate. His young son, Michael, became puppet king.

Accompanied by Magda Lupescu, his mistress, Carol fied to Spain, thence to Portugal, where he boarded a U. S. liner to Bermuda. He arrived in Havana, Cubs, by plane May 12, 1941.

Later he moved to Mexico.

Carol renounced his right of succession to the Rumanian throne in 1925, returned in 1930 to succeed 9-year-old Michael, who had been king under a regency for been king under a regency for three years.


