Roosevelt Speech Will Give Answer To All Questions

Radio Address on Foreign Policy to Leave No Unanswered Problems; Part of Talk to Be Devoted to Aid For Soviet Russia.

Washington, Sept. 11.—(AP)—President Roosevelt's radio address on foreign policy tonight was described at the White House today as one of the best informational addresses which will be "all covering" and will leave no unanswered questions. Stephen Early, the press secretary who said this, also declared that the address would devote part of today to the Russian aid question, to covering the American mission to Russia headed by W. Averell Harriman.

Washington, Sept. 11.—(AP)—A special Senate investigating committee reported today there was no actual shortage of gasoline or other petroleum products in the United States and recommended immediate removal of existing restrictions. Accusing Secretary of Interior Harold I. Green, and his aides of "over enthusiasm" in creating "unnecessary alarm" among the public, the special committee said "unnecessary" shortages, as we see it, is a shortage of surplus—and not a shortage of product.

Children Like School Meals

Local Nutrition Expert Says They Eat What They Won't at Home.

Mrs. Thelma Currier, of 577 East Center street, this town, member of the Committee on Nutrition of the State Defense Council, stated today that "children eat food at school that they refuse at home. Teachers say that there is a marked improvement in the eating habits of the children where good appetizing lunches have been served to the children. One cannot do very much about improving the food likes and dislikes of adults, but children are easily swayed and will eat what other children are eating."

In schools where there are school lunch programs, according to Mrs. Currier, eyes are bright, children are alert, conduct problems decrease and scholastic as well as health records improve. Hot lunches are already being served in over fifty schools in Connecticut and cities are being urged to provide school lunches where they are not already in operation. The school lunch program is being emphasized as part of the national defense program in the belief that the building of strong, healthy children is of vital importance to our nation.

In some towns a group of parents and teachers have cooperated with the local school board in providing lunches for the school children. Mrs. Currier has received requests for information from many new towns since the opening of school this fall.

Additional information may be secured from Mrs. Dorothy S. Bowles of the State Defense Council, State Armory, Hartford, who will be glad to advise on planning such a program.
