## Russian Units Cross Dnieper River Again; Rain, Mud Obstacles

**Germans Admit Invasion Of Russia Made Difficult; Insist Operations Are Progressing Well; 'Stronger' Red Troop Concentrations Under 'Effective Fire' by Artillery of Germans.**

Berlin, Sept. 12.—(AP)—The German high command admitted today that rain and mud were making the Nazi invasion of Russia difficult but insisted operations were nevertheless "progressing well."

"Stronger" Russian troop concentrations in the central sector yesterday were taken under "effective fire" by German artillery, DNB said, resulting in the dispersing of Soviet units.

Hitler flights reported in the northern area, where German forces advanced despite "stubborn resistance and widespread mine fields." One Army corps reported clearing up 6,000 mines in two days while taking Soviet field positions and one town, military sources said.

Soviet losses in this area were estimated here at 1,200 prisoners, 12 tanks and 60 artillery pieces. At another point in the same sector DNB said the Germans made further territorial gains as well.

The agency said a German combat plane yesterday bombed a munitions dump at Tobruk, Libya, causing "a big fire and heavy demolitions" at that British-held North African strong point.

**Five Days in Leningrad**

German military sources, declaring that many fires set by bombs and shells were raging in Leningrad, said today they expected announcements soon of "decisive" German victories along the southern and middle sectors of the Russian front. The high command has been silent as to eastern front details.

Vichy, Unoccupied France, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Informed sources reported today another attack on a German Army man in Paris in the reprisals and counter-reprisals between occupying authorities and opposition forces.

The German was clubbed by an unidentified assailant as he was leaving the Ambassadeurs theater in the Champ Elysees district after a Maurice Chevalier performance. He was given first-aid treatment for skull injuries and then sent to his quarters.

**British Bombers Raid Kiel and Baltic Port**

**Large Fires Left Burning at Both Naval Base and Rostock; German Ships Also Attacked.**

London, Sept. 12.—(AP)—British bombers attacked German and German-occupied territory from Norway to France last night, concentrating on northern Germany, including Kiel Naval base, and the Baltic port of Rostock. It was the first attack on Rostock. The Air Ministry said that despite bad weather "considerable forces" left large fires burning at both Kiel and Rostock.

**Claim Capture of Island And Two Villages Even as New Reverses Dash All of Hitler's Hopes of Equalling Napoleon's 83-Day March To Moscow; Germans Are Being Driven Back**

Moscow, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Counter-attacking Russians crossed the lower Dnieper at four points today and claimed capture of an island and two villages from the Germans even as new reverses for the Wehrmacht in the bloody Smolensk central sector dashed all Adolf Hitler's hopes of equalling Napoleon's 83-day march on Moscow.

In his third day of the Nazi invasion, Marshal Semyon Timoshenko's central Red Army reported capture of the village of Orliska as its latest success in the continuing westward drive against the invaders. Red Star, the Soviet Army newspaper, said a platoon scored the village in the first day of the drive. More than 100 dead men, 17 field guns and 10 mortars were left behind.

**Fight in Central Zone**

Fighting extended all up and down the central zone, Red Star said. The Germans were being driven back upon Smolensk at the rate of 7 to 10 miles a day. In the new Soviet counter-attacks along the lower Dnieper, the Germans have made their greatest gains, the island of Hortulna was captured from German and Rumanian forces, who had been on the island since July 20, Red Star said.

The villages of Vokhryevka and Fedovka on the west bank fell to surprise attacks by Russians who blew up a bridge to cut off the foe's escape, it reported.

During last night, the Soviet communiqué said, "our troops continued to light the enemy along the entire front."

The supplement to the communiqué said that a Soviet air squadron destroyed 22 of 30 planes on an airfield as it approached.

**Lower Limits On Exemptions**

**Joint Conference Committee Agrees to Reduced Income Figures.**

Washington, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Informed legislators said today a joint Senate-House Conference Committee had agreed to lower income tax exemptions. Exemptions will require an estimated \$1,100,000 additional persons to make out income tax returns next year. The reduced exemptions will free annual income from \$2,000 to \$3,000 and that of single individuals from \$1,000 to \$1,500, as estimated by the Treasury to yield \$200,000,000 a year.

Only about \$40,000,000 of the additional revenue would be paid by new taxpayers, Finance Committee members said. The remaining \$160,000,000 would be paid by those already paying income taxes. In the form of a substitute bill, the committee estimated that 2,200,000 tax filers would have to pay income taxes next year. **Movie Fights Called Stiff**

**Willkie Says Competition Is Fiercest of Any Industry in the U. S.**

Washington, Sept. 12.—(AP)—Wendell L. Willkie, defending the motion picture producers from "monopoly" charges voiced before a Senate committee, asserted today the movie makers were engaged in "the fiercest cut-throat competition of any industry in the country."

The 1940 Republican presidential nominee told reporters that instead of cooperating in a calculated program to nullify war propaganda into films, the motion picture companies were "cutting each other to pieces" in their efforts to get top box-office success.

Willkie is representing the movie industry in hearing before the Senate Interstate Commerce Subcommittee on a resolution by Senators Nye (R-ND) and Clark (D-MO) to investigate reports of collusion between movie makers and the War Relocation Authority.

John T. Flynn, newspaper and magazine writer who testified yesterday before the committee, urged the committee to act toward breaking up what he charged was a monopolistic enterprise operating in a private enterprise against the dissemination of peace appeals while working to divide the country in war.

**Convicts Use Stir Horse In Preparing for Rodeo**

"Get stuck in the rowdier," one of the riders said. "And if you don't watch out it will take you a mile."

The rodeo, an annual event at McAlester penitentiary, will be a memorial this year to its founder, Warden Jess Dunn, slain with four others in a break Aug. 10.

"Only two events are open to outsiders—calf roping and bull-dogging."

The biggest inside the walls rodeo is held today, with the real bronco riding, wild horse milking and trick riding.

Exhibitions by world champion trick and fancy ropers and riders and cowboy bronco riders from the outside help round out the program.

## America Confronting World Conquest Foe; Nazis Sink 22 Ships

**U-Boat Attack on Convoy, Perhaps Greatest Single Sub Action in History, Is Taken as Eloquent Answer to Roosevelt; Reference to Freedom of Seas 'Peak of Hypocrisy'.**

Berlin, Sept. 12.—(AP)—The German high command today countered President Roosevelt's no-trespass speech with the announcement that U-boats have sunk at least 22 ships out of a Great Britain-bound convoy, and an authorized spokesman later declared: "All Roosevelt's contentions are lies." The U-boat attack was, perhaps, the greatest submarine action against commerce in history and many quarters took that, itself, as an eloquent answer to President Roosevelt.

A spokesman later asserted, however, that the president's reference to freedom of the seas was the peak of hypocrisy and declared that it must bear responsibility "for all consequences."

There was no amplification of the high command's terse account of the submarine attack, which has been going on for several days in an unspecified area of the North Atlantic but the high command and other commentators said scattered vessels still are being chased.

Late dispatches disclosed the convoy was intercepted on its way from North America to England.

The spokesman who gave Germany's first official Roosevelt reference, contended that the president's order to fire on German craft had been issued long ago.

"What happens now?" he asked.

"Not Mr. Roosevelt, but we will determine that," he retorted.

The spokesman said he was pointing the president's allegation to check the imperialistic campaign against American shipping.

**Revolt Spirit Growing Fast**

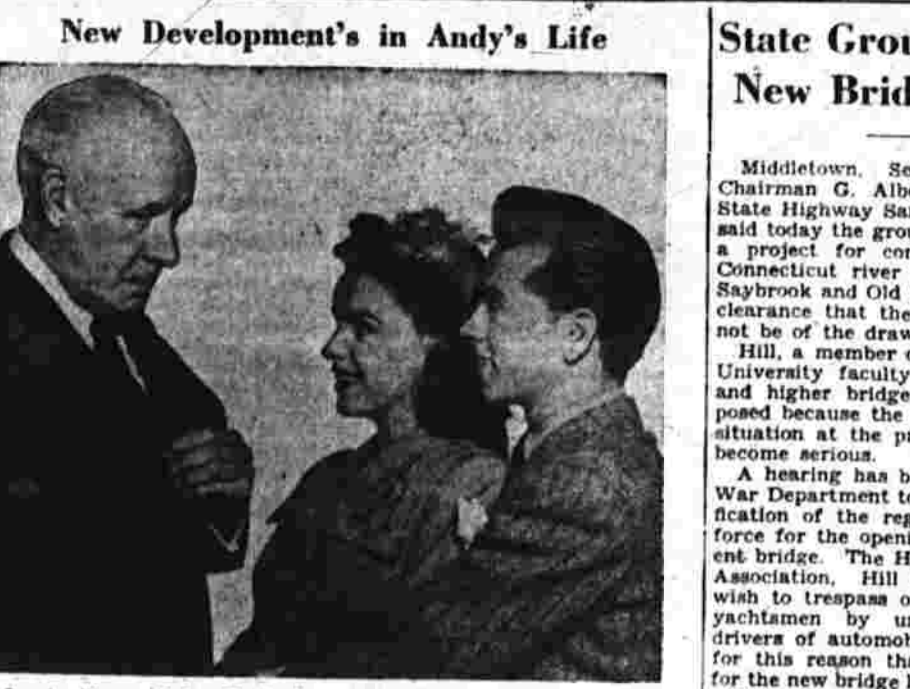

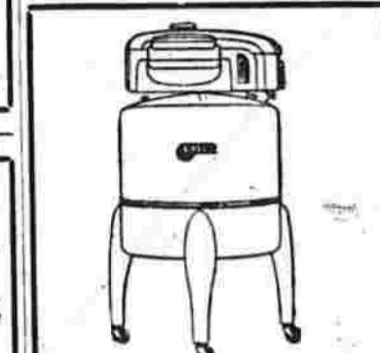

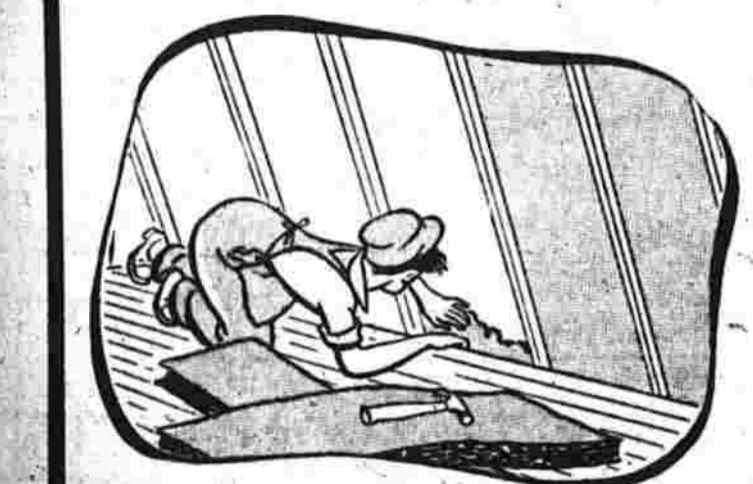
