

### Soviets Roll Back Nazis' Offensive Against Bryansk

Recapture 26 Towns, Villages, Inflict Loss of Almost 10,000 Germans in Long, Bloody Battle; Two Nazi Tank Corps Routed in Fight.

Moscow, Sept. 13.—(AP)—The Red Army was reported today to have rolled back a great German offensive on Bryansk, 220 miles southwest of Moscow, to have recaptured 26 towns and villages, and inflicted a loss of almost 10,000 Germans in a long, bloody battle. The German drive was reported made by 12 German Infantry Divisions (about 180,000 men) and two tank corps.

Dispatches said the 47th and 24th German Tank Corps were routed and estimated that besides nearly 10,000 officers and men, the Germans lost more than 200 tanks, 600 vehicles and hundreds of field guns.

The Germans broke through toward Bryansk, midway on the Kiev-Moscow railway, late in August, according to these reports, but were defeated by a Russian counter-offensive which began 12 days ago.

In the sector about 130 miles northwest of Bryansk, persistent Red Army counterattacks were said to have recaptured Stalovo, a village in the vicinity of Simolenko. Two German regiments were reported broken through in these counterattacks.

Near Russian-recaptured Yelnya, within 50 miles of Smolensk, these reports said, the Germans failed in another "psychological" attack.

Two hundred absorbing, wild-riding Nazi motorcyclists, they said, sped across a field toward Red Army positions, but the infantry held their fire until the attackers were within close range, then scattered them with rifle and machine-gun fire.

Work in Close Harmony  
Dispatches from the Bryansk front indicated Russian infantry, artillery, tanks and planes working in close harmony, were carrying out pioneer movements against armored Nazi wedges and destroying them piecemeal.

At the same time an increasing threat to Kiev, capital of Ukraine, was disclosed in official acknowledgment of the fall of Chernigov.

Russian war correspondents said the Germans left 4000 prisoners of the 48th Tank Corps for the assault on the Bryansk sector, then added another tank corps, considerable Air Force and nine Infantry Divisions.

The victim was Charles Saxic, 48. He died at Hartford hospital this morning after he was crushed unconscious and robbed at about 1:30 a. m. in an alley near his home.

The three youths will be presented in police court today, according to Deputy Chief Thomas Hickey who announced the charges.

They are: William Stears, 21; Charles Starowski, 19, and Victor Zeruk, 19.

Two Admit Assault

Blackout Test Of Full State Seen Successful

Washington, Sept. 13.—(AP)—The arming of American merchant ships was described in authoritative quarters today as a step likely to be proposed by the administration, supplementing President Roosevelt's orders to the Navy to shoot first at Axis warcraft in American defense waters.

The arming of merchantmen was reported to have been discussed privately at a White House conference when President Roosevelt gave congressional leaders a preview of his Thursday night radio address. One legislator said he came away with the impression that it was only a matter of time until the suggestion would be put into concrete form.

Such a step, it was pointed out, would require congressional repeal—or at least revision—of the neutrality act, since that law specifically prohibits American commercial vessels from carrying other than small arms.

The latest reported attack on an American-owned vessel took place even before the president told the world that he had ordered the British to defend shipping in the Atlantic.

The State Department said the ship had learned that the 110-ton freighter Montana, of Panamanian registry and with a foreign crew, had been torpedoed off the coast of Greenland, at latitude 57 degrees 40 minutes north longitude 52 degrees 50 minutes west.

### Soviets to Let Gas Shortage Dispute Resolved

Time Will Tell Who Is Wrong in Controversy; Walsh Asserts More Tankers Reach Boston.

Washington, Sept. 13.—(AP)—An informed source said today that a Senate investigating committee had decided to let a controversy over the reported eastern gasoline shortage work itself out.

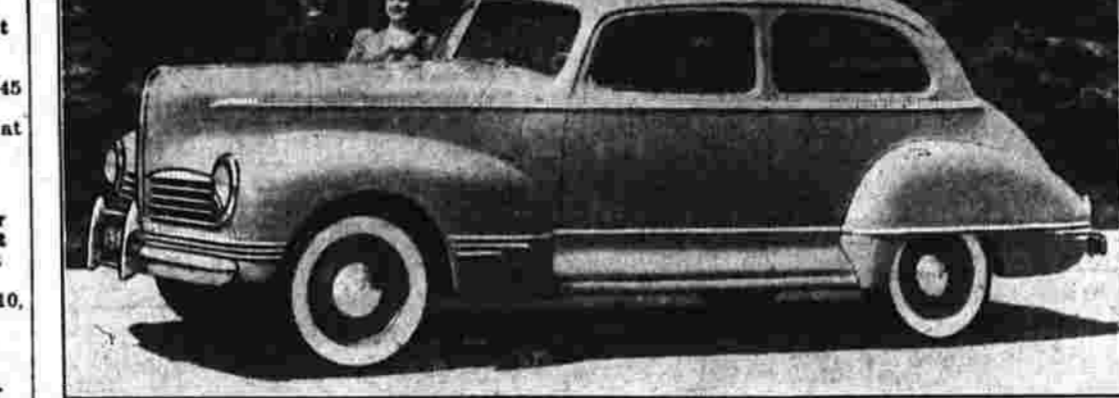
