Neutrality Law's Change Discussed At Session Today

Revision Considered by Legislative Leaders at Parley with Roosevelt at White House; Rayburn Asserts No Conclusions Reached.

Washington, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Speaker Rayburn told his press conference today that no conclusions had been reached in the discussion of the neutrality law, but that it was expected that some change would be made.

At the same time, Rayburn said the president would send a message to Congress Thursday on the subject of a new lend-lease appropriation which is for m o d resources and would amount to about \$6,000,000,000.

Since President Roosevelt's order to the Navy to shoot Axis sea raiders on sight in American defensive waters, there has been considerable speculation as to whether outright merchant ships into combat zones, might be proposed or whether the arming of merchant vessels would be undertaken.

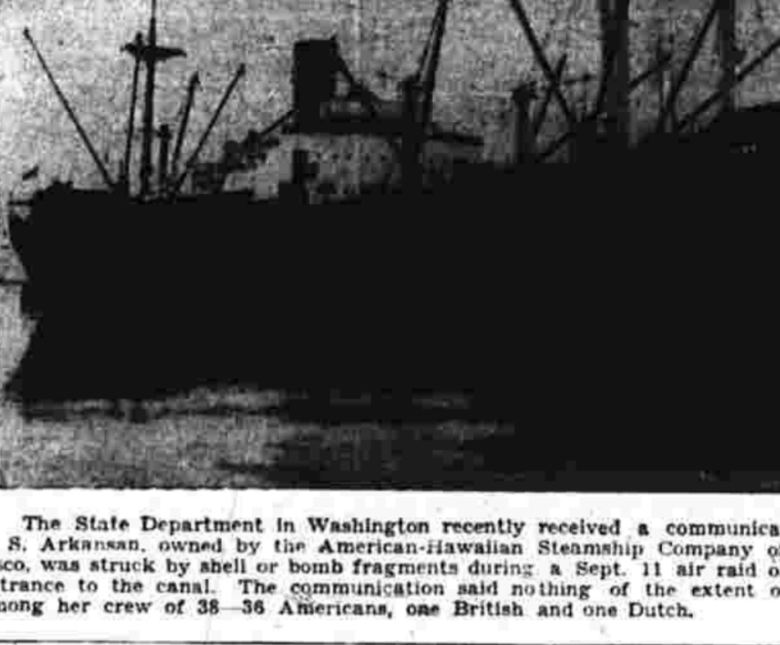
A provision of the neutrality law forbids the arming of merchant ships engaged in commerce with any foreign nation after the president has proclaimed a state of war exists between any countries.

Amid reports that a German raider was operating in the Pacific approaches to the Panama Canal, the Senate Naval Committee will be asked to decide whether there should be an investigation of the North Atlantic shipping clash between the U. S. and Germany.

Chairman Walsh (D-Mass.), who summoned the committee to meet Wednesday, said he would not question the Navy's operations, but the Greer incident—one of the recent series of incidents—President Roosevelt's shoot-on-sight speech Thursday night.

Walsh told reporters that the type of incident which might be involved in this country is war. Congress and the country are entitled to know the facts and I shall ask the committee to conduct an open hearing.

Struck by Shell Fragments in Suez



The State Department in Washington recently received a communication to the effect that the S. S. Arkwood, owned by the American-Israelian Steamship Company of New York and San Francisco, was struck by shell or bomb fragments during a Sept. 11 air raid on Suez, town at the Red Sea entrance to the canal.

The communication said nothing of the extent of damage or of casualties among her crew of 38. She is British and one Dutch.

Further south, the Red Sea, the American Legion's ship, the "Delaney," was reported to have been struck by a shell on the night of Thursday.

The announcement constituted the first official disclosure of the damage to the "Delaney" and the British press broke out the news with headlines such as "U. S. Ship Hit by Shell."

The British continued their offensive operations during the week-end with a series of sweeps along the coast.

The British said all their planes returned safely from the week-end sweeps.

Nazis Aver Leningrad Outer Defenses Cut; Admit River Crossed

Russians Acknowledge Germans in Sector South of Kiev; Rail Junction of Kremenchug in Nazi Hands 'After Days of Fierce Fighting'; Red Armies Hold Firm in South.

Moscow, Sept. 15.—(AP)—The Red Army reported today that Germany's heavy losses in the fighting line were being forced to strip garnisons from many occupied points at the rear and use them for front reinforcements, thus giving greater relief to the Russian guerrillas.

Any talk of a separate peace with Moscow was ruled out, however, by Valto Tanner, minister of trade and communications and leader of the dominant Social Democratic party.

He stressed that Finland was an ally of Germany "only by accident" and that this country would continue to fight only as long as her interests demanded.

The Soviet afternoon communiqué reported merely that the Red Army fought the invaders along the entire front last night, dropping bombs which caused minor damage and a few casualties in the northeast town.

The announcement emphasized the R. A. F.'s claim that the battle of Sept. 15, 1940, established the control of the skies over Britain and forced the Germans to abandon their plan to invade the British Isles.

Finland May Be Near End Of Her War

Possibility Heightened By Declaration of Official There Are Good Hopes of Peace Soon.

Helinski, Finland, Sept. 15.—(AP)—The possibility that Finland may be near the end of her war with Soviet Russia was heightened today by the declaration of government spokesmen that there are "good hopes of peace in the near future."

Any talk of a separate peace with Moscow was ruled out, however, by Valto Tanner, minister of trade and communications and leader of the dominant Social Democratic party.

He stressed that Finland was an ally of Germany "only by accident" and that this country would continue to fight only as long as her interests demanded.

The Soviet afternoon communiqué reported merely that the Red Army fought the invaders along the entire front last night, dropping bombs which caused minor damage and a few casualties in the northeast town.

Miners Again Fail to Obey Work Order

Hard Coal Men Disregard Union Leaders' Opening Collapses.

Hastings, Pa., Sept. 15.—(AP)—For the third time more than 10,000 Pennsylvania hard coal miners disregarded orders from their union leaders today and continued work stoppage that has closed 14 collieries.

An attempt to reopen two of the operations this morning collapsed after a motorcycle of insurgent members of the CIO United Mine Workers of America roared up to the mines and gathered about 200 men.

At neither place was there sufficient workers on hand to resume operations. A third mine, the Hamilton shaft colliery of the Lehigh Valley Coal Company, one of the largest in the district, remained closed.

Solons Return To Their Jobs After Holiday

Leaders Call for Fast Action on Huge Revenue Bill; Carry Heaviest Tax Burden.

Washington, Sept. 15.—(AP)—President Roosevelt reported to Congress today that actual exports of American war supplies to nations fighting the Axis, under the lend-lease program, had totaled \$196,472,770 up to Aug. 31. This figure represented expenditures for weapons and other supplies actually sent abroad.

Washington, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Members of Congress got back on the job today after an extended legislative holiday, and leaders called for fast action on the unprecedented \$5,000,000,000 revenue bill.

The House has had a month's vacation, and almost every income tax bill has been introduced since the session resumed.

Knox Avers Navy Will Protect All Cargoes

Fleet Given Orders to Capture or Destroy Every Axis Surface or Sub-Surface Raider.

Milwaukee, Wis., Sept. 15.—(AP)—Secretary Knox told the American Legion's convention today that, beginning tomorrow, the United States Navy would protect all seagoing cargo vessels traversing the sea, "deluging the American continent and the waters adjacent to Iceland."

The Navy chief described the Axis raiders in unequivocal language—"until they are destroyed, every Axis surface or sub-surface raider is our enemy."

With the Second Army in Louisiana, Sept. 15.—(AP)—A lightning invasion of Third Army territory, the Second Army's 120,000 troops swept across the Red river along a 100-mile front a few hours after the biggest maneuver in the nation's history started today.

Alexandria, La., Sept. 15.—(AP)—Half a million troops of the Second and Third Armies, trained to razor edge in preliminary maneuvers, advanced on each other in pouring rain and mist today to test themselves and the nation's newest battle weapons.

Asks Prayers On Short War

Pope Makes Appeal to Catholics for Special Prayers in October.

Vatican City, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Pope Pius XII asked Catholics throughout the world today to pray during the month of October for a shortening of the war.

His appeal for special prayer representatives in each country was made to bishops through a Vatican City newspaper, *Osservatore Romano*, announced.

The pope's call to pray for peace was similar to those he has made during the past two years of the approach of October, the month dedicated to the Madonna in the Catholic calendar.

British Rout Tank Forces

Disorganized Axis Armored Columns Fall Back to Libyan Area.

Chenoi, Egypt, Sept. 15.—(AP)—Two Axis armored columns based in Libya penetrated 25 miles into Egyptian territory yesterday but were routed by British mechanized forces operating under close cover today.

The disorganized Italian-German forces were said to have fallen back to Libyan territory.

British general headquarters called the Axis thrust "a roomy maneuver in force" and said that it reached "no real salient" into Egypt.
