Roosevelt Rejects Plans for Military Defense Jobs Rule

Has Taken Action to Insure Civilian-Dominated Agencies Control Supply of Raw Materials, Priorities, Production and Exports.

Washington, Sept. 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, informed quarters reported today, has rejected proposals that would have placed a greater degree of control over defense industry in military hands. Refusing recommendations designed to extend the Army's authority, Mr. Roosevelt took action to insure that the civilian-dominated governmental agencies administered the defense program. The president's decision was the major development to date in what was described as a long and spirited behind-the-scenes battle for control of defense production and regulation of export trade.
