

## Nazi and Fascist Tourists Are Told To Leave Mexico

### Other Europeans Also Notified; Times of Departures Depend Upon Expiration of Dates of Permits; Expired Visas Will Not Be Extended.

Mexico City, Sept. 20.—(AP)—The Mexican government, considering adoption of a bill providing severe penalties for Fifth Column activity, was said by authorized circles today to be notifying many German, Italian and other European tourists they were to leave Mexico. Times of departure depend upon the expiration date of six-months visiting permits. Most of these already have expired, it was reported, and visas will not be extended.

Four bills intended to tighten restrictions against totalitarian agencies in Argentina were announced by the Argentine Congressional Committee investigating subversive activity. There was fresh anti-German street demonstrations in Buenos Aires.

Several hundred arrested authorized circles said several hundred Germans and Italians were affected by the Mexican action, interpreted as a precaution against the possible resurgence of agitators. Old established residents and political refugees, the newspaper Excelsior said, will not be forced to leave.

The official pressure was reported soon after an announcement that President Manuel Avila Camacho had asked Congress to adopt immediately a law providing prison sentences ranging from six to 15 years for espionage and from three to six years for spreading propaganda or inciting the public to favor any foreign power.

Mexico and the United States both are seeking strongly "the democratic solidarity of the Americas in defense of the ideas of justice and liberty," the chief executive declared last night in answering a congressional message sent by President Roosevelt on the 13th anniversary of Mexican independence Tuesday.

## Ration Plan For Autos Seen Soon

### More Drastic Curtailment of Production Is Expected by Head of Dealers Association.

Detroit, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Take good care of your automobile—the time may not be far off when they will be rationed to buyers who need them most.

## Super-Budget May Be Task Of New Unit

### 14-Man Committee Authorized to Investigate Non-Defense Expenditures to Make Cuts.

Washington, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Legislative leaders said today that a new 14-man committee authorized to investigate non-defense expenditures may write a "super-budget" designed to make substantial reductions in present outlays for domestic activities.

The committee, authorized in a Senate amendment to the record \$3,555,400,000 revenue bill, will be set up as soon as President Roosevelt signs the tax measure. It will consist of the secretary of the Treasury, the budget director and a dozen members of the Senate and House Taxing and Appropriating Committees. Its duty will be to make a thorough inquiry in order to curtail non-defense spending. It would have a \$10,000,000 operating fund.

Effective Reductions Seen Chairman George D. C. of the Senate Finance Committee told reporters today that "the new body may be able to make very effective reductions in non-defense spending by formulating a program which the people and the members of Congress would support."

George said that since both the administration and Congress were represented on the group, it should be able to formulate a workable plan.

## To Urge Speed On Spies Act

### Navy Requests Legislation Affecting Radio Operators on Ships.

Washington, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Senator Radcliffe (D-Md.) said today he would ask for speedy action on the Navy Department's request for legislation to protect American merchant ships from radio operations.

At the same time Rear Admiral S. C. Hooper, spokesman for the Navy Department, rejected a suggestion from Sen. F. Kelly, president of the CIO American Congress, that the Navy Department should be authorized to conduct anti-spying operations by ships' radio operators.

Criticism Navy's Measure Kelly and other labor spokesmen at a Senate Subcommittee hearing yesterday criticized the Navy Department's measure as an unconstitutional "anti-union bill."

Under that measure, already approved by the House, the Federal Communications Commission could deny or suspend immediately the license of any radio operator accused of being a "subversive individual."

## Meriden Loses Church in Fire; Loss \$250,000

### Blaze Starts in Basement Beneath Organ and Spreads Through Wall To Attic of Edifice.

Meriden, Sept. 20.—(AP)—The First Methodist church was destroyed and the adjacent Rogers Memorial building, damaged by fire last night with an estimated loss of \$250,000.

The fire, of undetermined origin, started in the basement, beneath the organ and spread through a wall separating vestry room from the altar to an attic.

The edifice was recently renovated at a cost of \$40,000.

Two hours after the fire was discovered, the steeple topped by three firemen injured. Three firemen were injured, during the hours long, losing battle against the blaze. Capt. William Bennett and Substation Foreman Edward Przybylo suffered lacerated toes and Robert August Dandolati a cut on the head.

Robert Kierstead, sexton at the church, discovered flames shooting from the wall in back of the steeple, on the 10th floor, and attempted to put out the fire with a hand extinguisher. He was driven out of the church by the smoke.

As he ran for an alarm box, he learned that a policeman already had rung an alarm and a still greater fire was being fought in a heavy rain there last October.

## British Make Stettin Chief Target in Raids

### Many Large Factories Burning Among Docks—Warehouses, Railroad Yards; Nantes Bombed

London, Sept. 20.—(AP)—R. A. F. bombers made Stettin, Germany's largest Baltic port and an important Axis supply base for the eastern front, their chief target for night attacks and left many large fires burning among its docks, warehouses and railroad yards, an Air Ministry communique reported today. Coastal command reported that German-occupied France, overnight, the communique said, two British planes were shot down.

Denies Berlin Attack German reports that Berlin also was the object of air attack brought from the authoritative Press Association, however, the assertion that the R. A. F. had not attempted to raid the Nazi capital.

The assertion stirred speculation here that Soviet bombers might have struck at Berlin. A British armored car raid on the German capital was last reported in the Berlin press.

The Italians told of two "daring operations" by their troops in East Africa.

The garrison of Uolchert, in Ethiopia, "attacked and conquered an important position after strong resistance on the part of the enemy," the communique declared.

The enemy was routed and suffered heavy losses. Arms, ammunition and large quantities of supplies were captured.

Best Strong Enemy Forces The other sortie was at Chigla, Ethiopia, north of Lake Tana, where, the communique said, Italian national and colonial troops beat strong enemy forces.

"After a hard fight the enemy troops were compelled to retreat, leaving over 300 killed on the battlefield," the communique said.

The high command also reported that Italian planes attacked and heavily damaged a small merchant ship in the eastern Mediterranean.

## Dozen British Ships in Ports

### War Vessels Now in Harbors of United States Navy Department Says

Washington, Sept. 20.—(AP)—The Navy Department today announced a previous policy of strict secrecy, acknowledged today that more than a dozen British warships are in United States ports.

Twelve were listed by name, including the 35,000-ton battleship Wasp at Brewster, Wash. were others—namely undisclosed—were reported to be anchored in U. S. waters, under terms of the lease-lease act which gives them access to repairs and supplies at American shipyards.

Secretary Knox, in announcing the change on policy concerning the presence of British warships in United States ports, said that the Navy Department had been consulted with British officials. A "reasonable degree" of information will be released, he said, but "no information will be disclosed which might be of value to the enemy."

## Finn Envisions United Europe

### Political as Well as Economic Union Is Foreseen After War.

Berlin, Sept. 20.—(AP)—A United States of Europe was envisioned today as an outcome of the present war by Vaino Tanner, Finnish trade minister, who is visiting Germany at the invitation of the Reich's government.

"You mean, only an economic union of Europe, don't you?" asked one member of a small group of international journalists who met him at the Finnish legation.

"No, also political—why not?" he replied. "Unfortunately, it does not seem possible to achieve such a United States without war."

Prerequisite To Union Tanner said that the prerequisite of such a union of European nations, however, Tanner said, is the elimination of Bolshevism.

"This unhappy doctrine must disappear from the world," he said. "It has wrought nothing but misery and suffering for the peoples of Europe."

Tanner declined to answer directly a question by a German correspondent concerning Finland's attitude toward Axis plans for a new order.

"I cannot answer that question," he said with a smile, as leaning back comfortably, he puffed at a cigar. "We Finns don't yet know the plans for such a new order. Even when I asked our German friends for details they could not tell me."

## Plane Plants Workers May Go on Strike

### Threats Made in Factories on Both Coasts; Fear of Shortage of Soft Coal Is Eased.

The present minimum rate for both men and women is 44 cents an hour, with a 50-cent bonus for overtime.

Piano Purchase Of New Truck

Old LaFrance Apparatus Likely To Be Replaced This Year. With the annual meeting of the South Manchester Fire District only a little more than a month away, consideration is being given to the possible replacement of some of the fire fighting equipment.

The largest pump assigned for work on the East Side is the LaFrance 750 gallon capacity located at No. 4's house. This was the first pump bought by the district and was put in commission in the spring of 1914. It is equipped with solid rubber tires and after nearly 28 years of service is the one piece of apparatus that is most likely to be first replaced. There have been additions made to the pump from time to time to keep it up to date.

Because the district was in debt for nearly \$100,000 a few years ago there has been little done in the way of replacing the motor trucks although necessary hose and other equipments have been added. With the improved finances, the district closed the year last November with a cash balance of \$7,627.76. It may be decided that this would be a good year to purchase one new fire fighting apparatus.

There may have been some inconveniences as a result of closing the gas stations at seven o'clock in the evening, but we heard an observation the other day that gives a little different slant to the subject. The man we slanted to remarked that the gas station closing made it all the more noticeable how utterly without public outlets Manchester is. There isn't a public comfort station in town, and with the closing of the gasoline service stations people soon realize it.

Before the local National Guard company left for Camp Blanding they were given a farewell party, supper, entertainment and plenty of speeches. Our informant claims that Chef Fagan, who put on the roast beef dinner that night has been paid for his work. He still has \$60 coming to him, we were told.

Not all pharmacists agree with the Democratic office of Pharmacy that there is a shortage of available druggists in the state.
