Field Marshal Foch Led Allies in World War I IN 1939, France fell before the onslaughts of the German army in 39 days. This stunning defeat was partly caused by inferior and outmoded equipment, but it was

also due in large measure to the rottenness of the French general staff. French generals were found incompetent in World War I also, but were removed before their fumbling led to complete defeat. Master tactician in the first World War and the man who eventually led the allied armies to victory was Field Marshal Ferdinand Foch (1851-1929), who was hon-ored philatelically in the 1940 stamp above stamp above.


