\$3.76 Increase In Tax Burden

Per Capita in State Was \$132.50 Last Year According to Report.

Hartford, Sept. 25.—The 1940 per capita tax burden for Connecticut residents was \$132.50—an increase of \$3.76 over the 1939 figure of \$128.74, according to data made public today by State Tax Commissioner Charles J. McLaughlin in his annual report to Governor Hurley covering assessment and collection of taxes in Connecticut.

The document just published, being mailed to town, city and other municipal officials, contains detailed comparative statistics relative to assessment and tax levies for all tax districts of the state. It reviews the work of assessors, boards of tax review, and tax collectors, and shows actual receipts from federal, state, county, district and local taxation in Connecticut.

From all these tax sources the report shows that a total of \$230,463,629 was raised over a twelve-month period in 1940, as compared with \$218,717,641 for the same 1939 period—an increase of

\$11,746,988—or 5.34 per cent. Distribution of such receipts was as follows: Federal government, \$55,238,485, or 23.96 per cent of total; state of Connecticut, \$11,000,818, or 4.77 per cent; county, \$1,302,213, or .56 per cent; metropolitan district, \$234,731, or .10 per cent; and local municipalities, \$79,647,872, or 34.17 per cent.

It is noted that receipts in 1940 of the federal, county and local governments, an increase of 4.65 per cent; taxes of the federal government show a decrease of 1.98 per cent; the county governments a decrease of 7.59 per cent; and the metropolitan district, a decrease of 4.90 per cent.

Property taxes levied in Connecticut for the calendar year 1940 amounted to \$78,841,878 for all towns and local tax districts. This is an increase of \$72,811 or .09 per cent over the 1939 tax levies. The tax commissioner's statement also showed that the current grand total of the 169 counties of the state totaled \$3,089,162,602, and that this is an increase of \$35,842,500 over the previous year's total local assessment of \$3,053,320,102, or .94 per cent.

The average local property tax rate for the calendar year 1940 was \$2.16 per \$100 of assessed value, as compared with \$2.15 for the year 1939.

The tax commissioner's analysis shows further that the 1940 average tax rates for all towns vary from 48.3 mills for Griswold to 65.5 mills for the town of Sherman.

At the present time, he shows, there are 336 independent municipalities, including towns, cities, borough, school, fire, fire and sewer, village, sewer, lighting and improvement associations. The eight counties and the metropolitan district within Hartford county are not included in this number.

Hartford is leading in the year tax levies (estimated in certain cases) in the larger municipalities shown. The town of New Britain leads with 1941 tax levies of more than one million dollars, including taxes levied by lesser municipalities. Other towns include:

Huge Geysers of Smoke And Debris Thrown in Air Every Time Finnish Shell Lands.

 With the Finnish Army on the Svir River Front, Sept. 22—Delayed—(AP)—While Russian shells screamed overhead and burst in trees 300 yards away, I watched heavy Finnish gun bombardment cars on the Murmansk railway today in the Karelian Isthmus.

From an artillery observation post on heights overlooking Soviet positions two miles away, huge geysers of smoke and debris were seen thrown into the air every time a Finnish shell landed.

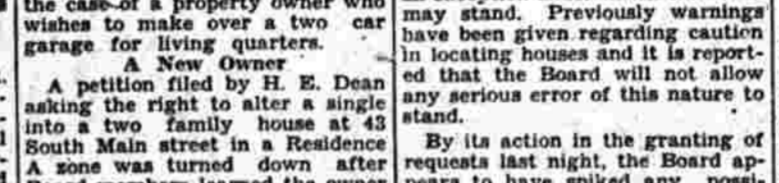

Arrest of several men here this week on charges of theft of various articles from building materials to furnishings has brought to light a policing problem in this and nearby towns that officials feel may reach serious proportions before long. The increasing num-

bers of defense and general laborers coming here from out of state is the basis of the problem which is continually growing more acute from a law enforcement viewpoint.

Drifters Get Jobs While firms employing labor have exercised great care in most instances in hiring their help, it is said that parole officials have found that large numbers of "drifters" have practically invaded behind them in their home states. Most of these records are for comparatively unimportant offenses, but they are background for possibilities of lawlessness of the type now starting to be felt here.

in particular seems to be the jumping off point for numbers of young "bums" who come here seeking work. If their records are ascertained they fail to get jobs, with the result that they turn to petty thievery. Many land here practically broke and the awing to crime is natural. The great majority of new residents does not fall into any such class, but the percentage of potential trouble makers is large enough to cause concern.

Many more complaints of thefts have been made than have been publicized and if any sudden halt of defense work should occur, the need for many more police might be felt.

More Police Work In addition to this police work,

inquiries of a detective nature are mounting in number as the government seeks information on alien connections have been made by federal request and this activity is increasing. Files are being completed on persons of known sympathies which are counter to those of the United States government.
