Finns' Guns Bombard Soviet Freight Cars

Huge Geysers of Smoke And Debris Thrown in Air Every Time Finnish Shell Lands.

By Paul Sjoeblom With the Finnish Army on the With the Finnish Army on the Svir River Front, Sept. 22—Delayed)—(P)—While Russian shells acreamed overnead and burst in trees 200 yards away, I watched heavy Finnish guns bombard freight cars on the Murmanak railroad and other military objectives today in the Karellian town of Lodeinos pole on the southern shore of the broad Svir.

From an artillery observation bost on heights overlooking the Soviet positions two miles away, huge geysers of smoke and debris were seen thrown into the air every time a Finnish shell landed. In the railroad yard, seen clearly through field glasses, a big fire started the moment a shell hit. Officers shid that judging from the size and intensity of the confagration the shell must have hit an ammunition dump.



Defense Jobs Of Export Licenses

Economic Defense Organization Also Issues List' for 300 Names.

Washington, Sept. 26.—(A)—The Economic Defense Board headed by Vice President Wallace further ceptralized control of economic warfare and kindred defense measures today by taking over the issuance of all export licenses in the \$4,000,000,000-a-year foreign trade of the United States.

In line with President Roosevelt's order of Sept. 15 to "intensify the policy of preventing shipments to Axis-dominated countries," the Economic Defense Board began absorption of the State Department's Division of Controls, which heretofore has collaborated with the export control administration in regulating exports and issuance of export licenses.

Takes Over Issuance

Wallace's super-defense board already has taken over the previously independent and Army-directed Export Control Administration with the objective of integrating its functions into the broader work of the board.

Supplementary "Black List"
At the same time the economic defense organization issued a supplementary "black list" containing the names of 300 persons and firms in the other American republics to whom no more shipments of American goods will be permitted.
