## Nazis Destroy Three 'Red' Army Divisions; Rumanians Defeated

Reds Report Invaders Leave More Than 2500 Dead on Field of Battle; 300 Officers and Men and Quantities of War Material Captured in Action Which Still Is Continuing.

Moscow, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The Red Army announced today that it had routed two Rumanian infantry brigades in fierce fighting on the southern front, and reported the invaders had left more than 2,500 dead on the field of battle. Approximately 300 Rumanian officers and men and quantities of war material, including 47 pieces of artillery, were said to have been captured. The German press also reported heavy fighting also was reported on the northern sector of the front, where the Red Army was said to be more than holding its own against the German invaders.
