Contends Legislation Inadequate

A contention that pending price control legislation was inadequate to meet inflationary trends was contained in a study made public by the Brookings Institution.

Dr. Harold G. Moulton, president of the private research organization, and Meyer Jacobstein, a staff member were the authors of the study. They declared that prices of farm products would have to be reduced and wages controlled if rising prices were to be arrested. They said that a reduction in the price of farm products could be achieved by releasing a portion of the crops now stored in government warehouses. Farmers would still realize additional income, the authors of the study added, because of the government's plan to expand agricultural production.

Blamed For Prices Rising

A rise in farm prices and increasing labor costs were given a major share of responsibility for an increase of 21 per cent in wholessie prices since 1939.
