

Shipping Important Bottleneck
1. Coll says shipping is generally recognized as an important bottleneck after the war. So much food, clothes and medicines will have to be rushed to Europe that, it's believed, there will be little chance for private ship-owners to go shout their business without government direction.

Coll thinks, and hopes, the shipping tangle will be met by an international shipping committee which should be ready to go when the flag of truce is raised. He thinks it should allocate boats, under any flag, to hauf the most needed loads first.

If that happens, shipping will be tied, at least for a time, into the policy of the Allied governments.

(This attitude takes for granted an Allied victory. The planners all say that a stalemate or a Nazi victory would be only a breathing space between wars.)
