American Defense Machine Like Big Holding Company

Roosevelt's Orders Sent Through Variety of Subordinate Agencies And Interlocking Directors Down to Operating Units in Set-up.

Washington, Oct. 11.—(AP)—Like a giant holding company with policy-making, financing and planning companies at the top and a host of operating units underneath to carry out orders—that's the nation's ever-expanding defense machine, President Roosevelt is the one-man top holding company. His orders go forth through a variety of subordinate holding companies and interlocking directors down to the operating agencies. When he does not do his own ordering, he delegates orders to take over authority.

All told, there are about 25 permanent and emergency agencies in the gigantic machine. An alphabetical list-up never dreamed of in early New Deal days. All of these agencies for all practical purposes are directly under the executive office of the president. About half of them are technically under the Office of Emergency Management (OEM), another White House adjunct, but this agency serves merely as liaison or coordinator between the president and a dozen emergency defense agencies.

With Wayne Coy, a young Indianapolis, in charge, OEM furnishes information back and forth to save the president a detail paper and telephone work. One of its most important jobs is an exchange of letters between the president and OPM and the Federal Power Commission concerning a national daylight savings law.

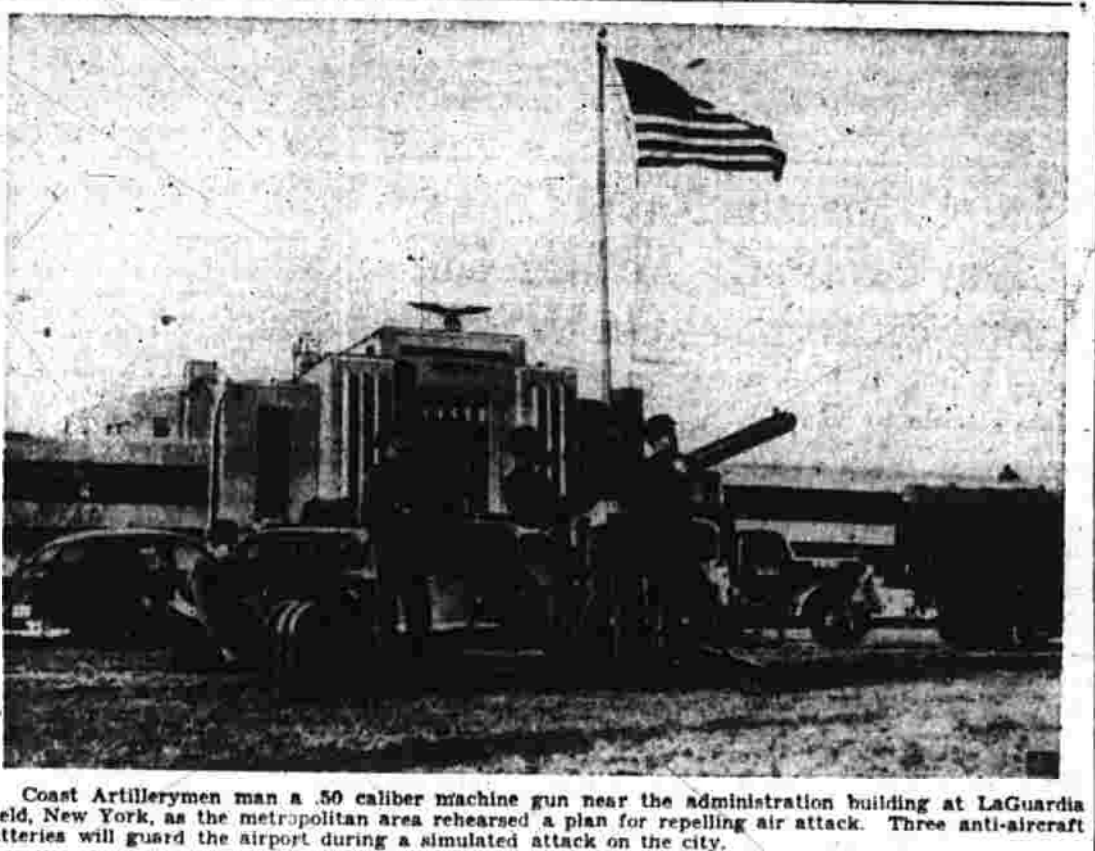

Hitler Spoils A Surprise

A DOLP HITLER doesn't usually tell what he's going to do until he's done it, but in his winter relief rally speech he broke his custom. While admitting that the Russian front were far from licked, he proclaimed that "a gigantic new development" was under way.

The world had to wait three more days before it found out what the big news was. It turned out to be another "wallop at Moscow. The drive along the road to Moscow, from the Smolensk area was renewed, another drive pressed down from the Valdai hills, 175 miles north, and a third drive started from the area of Bryansk, 150 miles to the south.

By Tuesday the Russians were admitting German gains and by Wednesday seemed badly perturbed. Soviet spokesman S. A. Lovozovky asserted:

"Hitler seeks to achieve a major success before the winter, sets by his biting cold and heavy snow. We are mobilizing the entire nation to meet this new assault. Probably the Germans have over a hundred thousand men which they wish to lose. They shall achieve that aim."

Some American observers wondered if the drive on Moscow was a phase of a German drive to gain rich areas further south. News analyst Kirkie Simpson said: "There are many indications that the German drive is aimed at Hitler's actualities is aiming."

Frank Donets Basin News tending to support this contention was seen in the Berlin announcement that Germany had flanked the rich industrial Donets basin by occupying the ports of Mariupol and Osipenko in the area of the way across the north shore of the Sea of Azov.

The drive on Leningrad meanwhile tapered off to a virtual siege operation. London cables said that British and German dickered for an exchange of wounded prisoners, more than 100 wounded Germans were taken from English hospitals to a Red Cross hospital ship, taken back to England, which had developed over Germany's insistence that the exchange be held in British territory.

Neutrality Law Before Firing Squad

ON SEPT. 23 the American-owned ship Pink Star, sailing under the flag of Panama, was torpedoed while enroute to Iceland. The sinking gave occasion to President Roosevelt to mention that perhaps the neutrality law had better be modified.
