Washington, Oct. 15.—(AP)—William S. Knudsen, director of the OPM, outlined to a Senate Appropriations Subcommittee today a defense production program calling for the expenditure of \$56,000,000 before the end of 1941. Chairman Adams (D., Colo.), said another witness, Secretary of Agriculture Wickard, told the committee there was no inconsistency in the proposed purchase of \$1,000,000,000 of food for Great Britain and statements credited to the British food minister that England's supplies were greater at the start of the third year of the war than they had been at the beginning of hostilities.

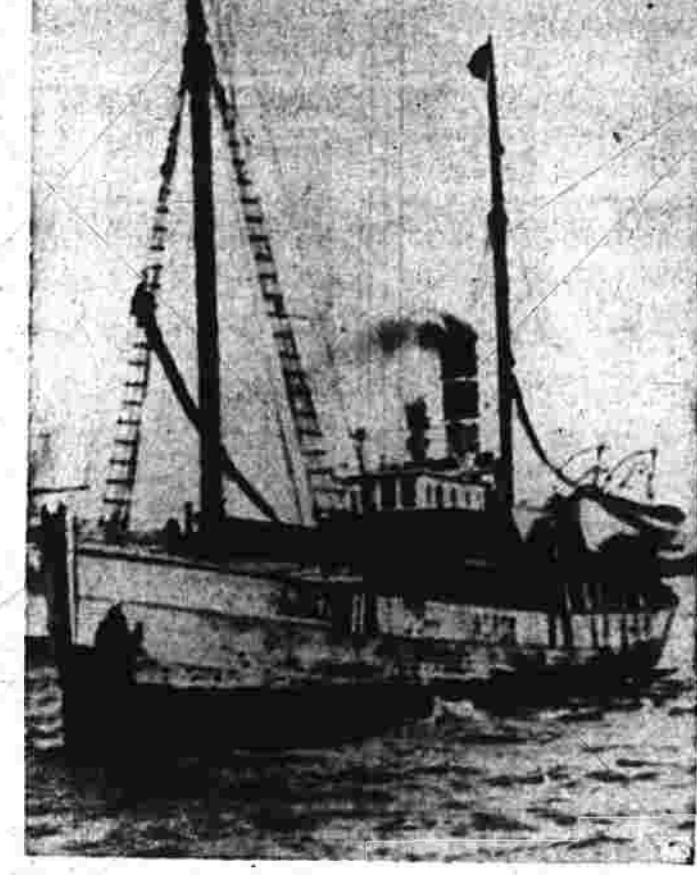

Crew Is Held Without Bail

Authorities Silent Concerning Next Move on Captured Nazis.

Boston, Oct. 15.—(AP)—The United States held without bail today the 20-man crew and a woman of the seized Norwegian fishing vessel Busko, described by naval authorities as a supply ship for a new "disposal of" Nazi German radio station in Greenland. Authorities maintained a close-lipped silence concerning the crew members, who listed themselves as

Leut. Comdr. Galsard Norwegian, and gave no hint of what the next move would be. Brought ashore under escort of a United States naval vessel, the Busko contingent was sent before an Immigration Service Board of Inquiry yesterday and charged with entering the United States without proper documents.

May Be Held Indefinitely The customary penalty would be deportation, but with transportation to their homeland unlikely, it was expected the 20 men and the woman—believed to be the wife of one of the crew—would be held indefinitely.

Seized of Greenland last month, the 60-ton Busko, unarmament and seaworn, was escorted into Boston harbor yesterday by the Bear, one-time flagship of the Byrd Antarctic expedition and now in naval service.

It was understood, however, that another vessel made the seizure.

Flies Norwegian Flag Ketch-rigged and equipped with a steam engine, the Busko flew the Norwegian flag when she arrived here. On her decks were electrical apparatus, silk, dog sleds, a husky and a huge black Newfoundland dog.

Sailors, Marines, Coast Guards, customs officers and agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation boarded her as soon as she was berthed.

The Busko was piloted to the berth by Lieut. Comdr. Joseph Galsard, who early in the war was captain of the American freighter City of Flint, which was seized by a German prize crew and later released.

Russia Shifts Planes in Iran

80 Transferred to Tabriz, 250 Miles Nearer Caucasus.

Teheran, Iran, Oct. 15.—(AP)—Eighty Russian bombers and fighters based at the Soviet Army of occupation were transferred today to Tabriz, in northern Iran, 250 miles nearer the Caucasus.

British military sources said they were not informed as to whether the Russians were abandoning construction of a big air base at Kaavin. It was reported that 50 Soviet fighters are still maintained by the Russians at the Chapin port of Pahlevi, 80 miles from Soviet territory.

90 Miles From Russia The first squadrons of bombers and fighters sent to Tabriz will be within 90 miles of Russian territory for use in the event Germans should extend their gains toward the oil-rich territory.

Under agreement with the Iranian government the Russian and British occupation troops due to leave Teheran in a few days.

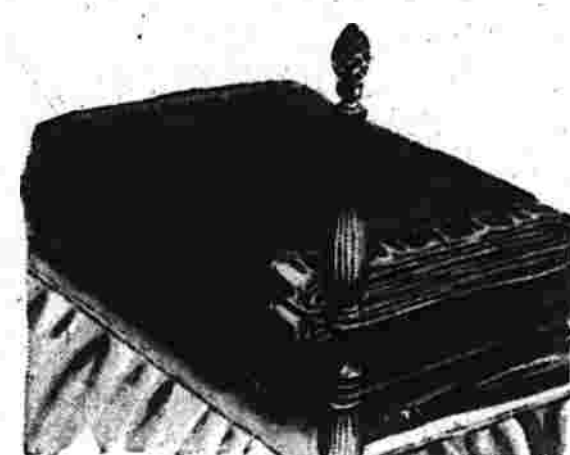
