Washington, Oct. 18.—(AP)—The capital today grimly awaited further word from the torpedo-damaged U. S. destroyer Kearny, reported to have been sunk in an encounter with a raider 250 miles southwest of Iceland. The Navy's terse official announcement, issued shortly after the attack yesterday morning, left many important questions unanswered. It did not specify whether the torpedo was fired by a submarine, surface raider or warplane; the nationality of the destroyer's adversary was not made known; and the degree of damage was not indicated, further than that the Kearny was able to proceed under her own power.

Expect Senate Will Speed Bill To Arm Ships

Administration Leaders Reported Discouraging Any Attempts to Offer Amendments to It.

Washington, Oct. 18.—(AP)—The Senate geared for final action within two weeks, received the House-approved merchant ship arming bill today while administration leaders were reported discouraging any amendments in the measure, a simple resolution repealing the neutrality act ban against cargo vessels carrying arms to the belligerents.

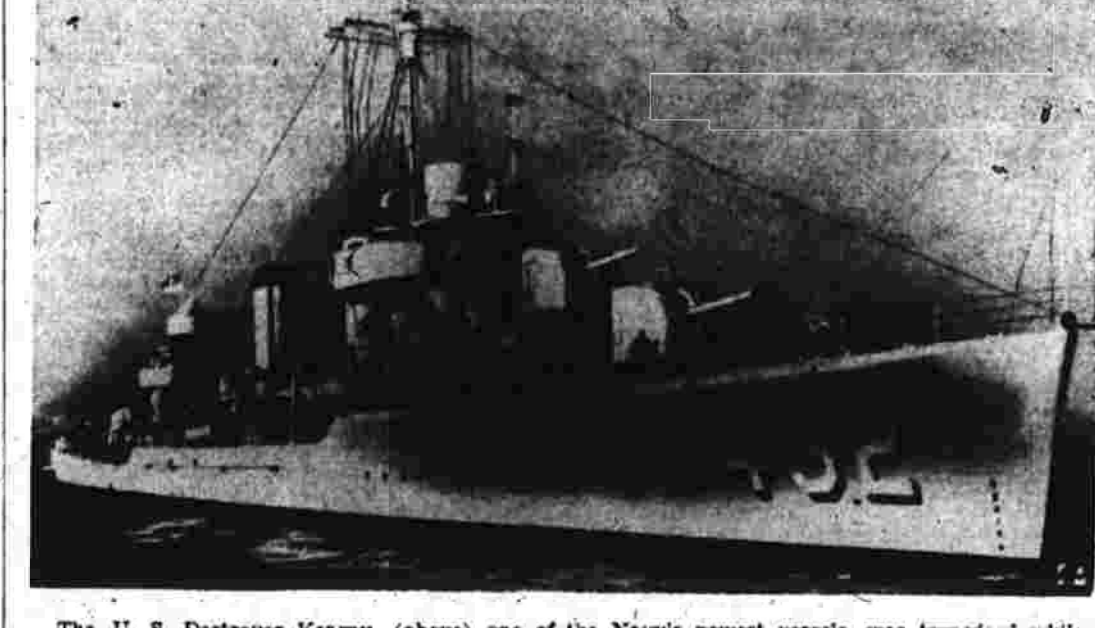

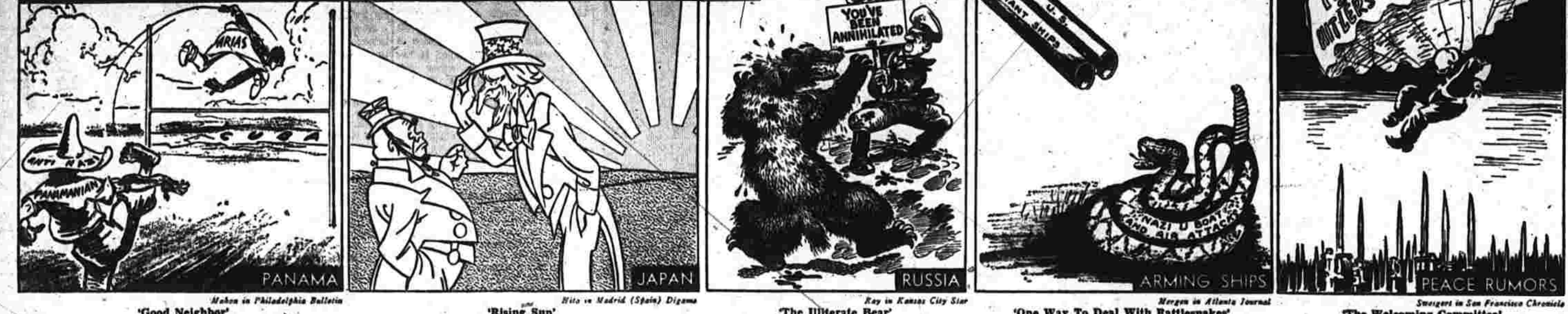

Guns And Ships Take The Floor

In the dark of a moonless night a huge flat-bottomed boat nosed eastward across the English Channel. No lights showing, it heads for the coast of France. In the hour before dawn it bounds over the surf and across the invasion of the continent is on!

With the stern resistance encountered in Russia, the panzers began to halt after each breakthrough, taking a time to consolidate a circle of steel.

ICELAND, where U. S. Marines were sent last July, is just inside the line President Roosevelt has set up as this country's eastern defense frontier. Greenland is well to the west of the line, and so it was quite a sensation to Americans to learn that a secret German radio station had been discovered on Greenland and that a supply ship had been brought into Boston by a U. S. Navy prize crew.

Creep Up On Moscow

As the week advanced the German forces moved to the shadow of Moscow's outer fortress ring, 60 to 75 miles outside the city. The columns rolled over three great avenues: (1) from Vyazma, west of the capital, (2) from Bryansk, south of Moscow, (3) from the Valdai hills, northwestern Moscow.

THE A-B-C OF INVASION TALK

With Russia hard pressed, there recently has been agitation in England for making a stab at it. Emanuel Shinwell, Laborite member of Parliament, said in a speech last weekend that Britain should create "diversions" on the continent, and the British Communist party demanded the opening of a new Western Front to "save British honor."

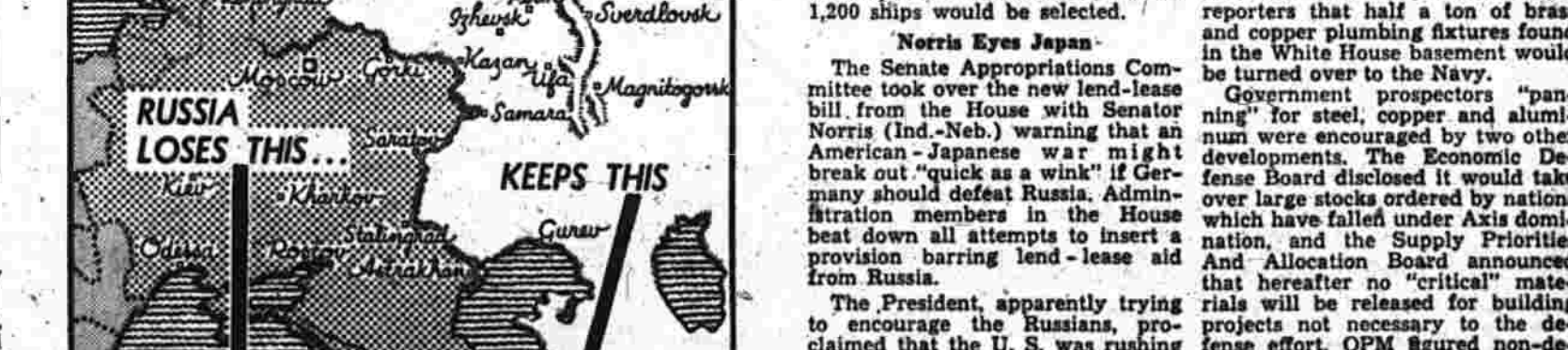

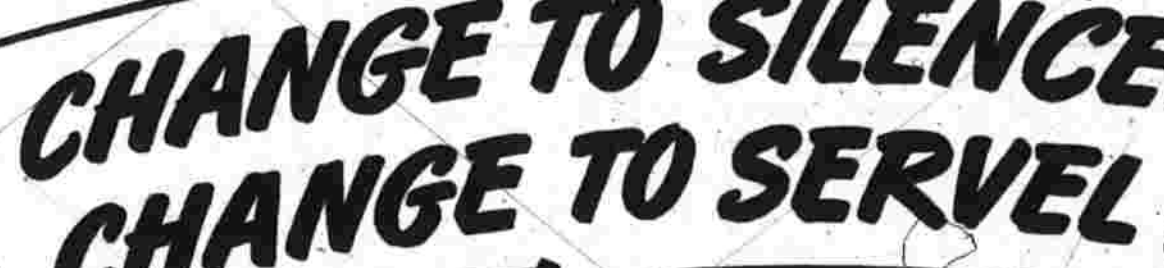
