Tojo Urges Unity Of Japs to Meet Any Encirclement

Declares Nation Standing at Cross Roads in National History; Appeal Issued in Order Of Day Directed to Tokyo War Office.

Tokyo, Oct. 20.—(AP)—Declaring Japan now stands at crossroads in her national history, Premier Gen. Eiki Tojo called today for "iron unity among all the fighting arms and the people to cope with the encirclement of Japan by foreign powers."

Tojo's appeal was issued in an order of the day directed to the war office in his dual role of premier and war minister.

"I must be ready to sacrifice everything to ensure peace and order," he said, "and I must be ready to sacrifice everything in order to surround the crucial hour which he said is facing Japan."

Tojo said it was his "firm determination" to "ensure peace and order" and cited as evidence of his purpose the fact that he was his own home minister as well as premier and war minister. (Since he home minister controls the civilian police this reference apparently was to domestic conditions.)

Asked by Japanese reporters to elaborate on this, the premier said he did not want to talk because there has been too much talk-already.

Peace Called Ultimate Goal

Shigenori Togo, new foreign minister, supported his chief of state's statement to the nation that "the ultimate goal of Japan's foreign policy lies in the maintenance and promotion of world peace, but we are firmly determined to defend our country whenever circumstances arise that menace the existence or any of the honor of the Japanese empire."

He declared that Japan "will surely be able to overcome the difficulties now confronting her and thus make way for the boundless destiny of the nation."

The premier, who returned to Tokyo to plane overnight after a pilgrimage to the temple of the sun goddess at Ise, immediately plunged into the task of reviewing the Japanese civil and military administration during their inner-circuit, united control.

Shakeup in Police Heads

One of his first moves as home minister—a post he assumed along with the premiership and military—was an unexpected and sweeping shakeup of the department's police bureau heads.

By "encirclement of Japan" the Japanese understood their new minister to refer to the military and economic measures taken recently by the United States, Britain, China and Dutch East Indies and Russia's part in the war against the Axis.

The Japanese generally insisted that the new government was not a "shakeup" but a "renewal."

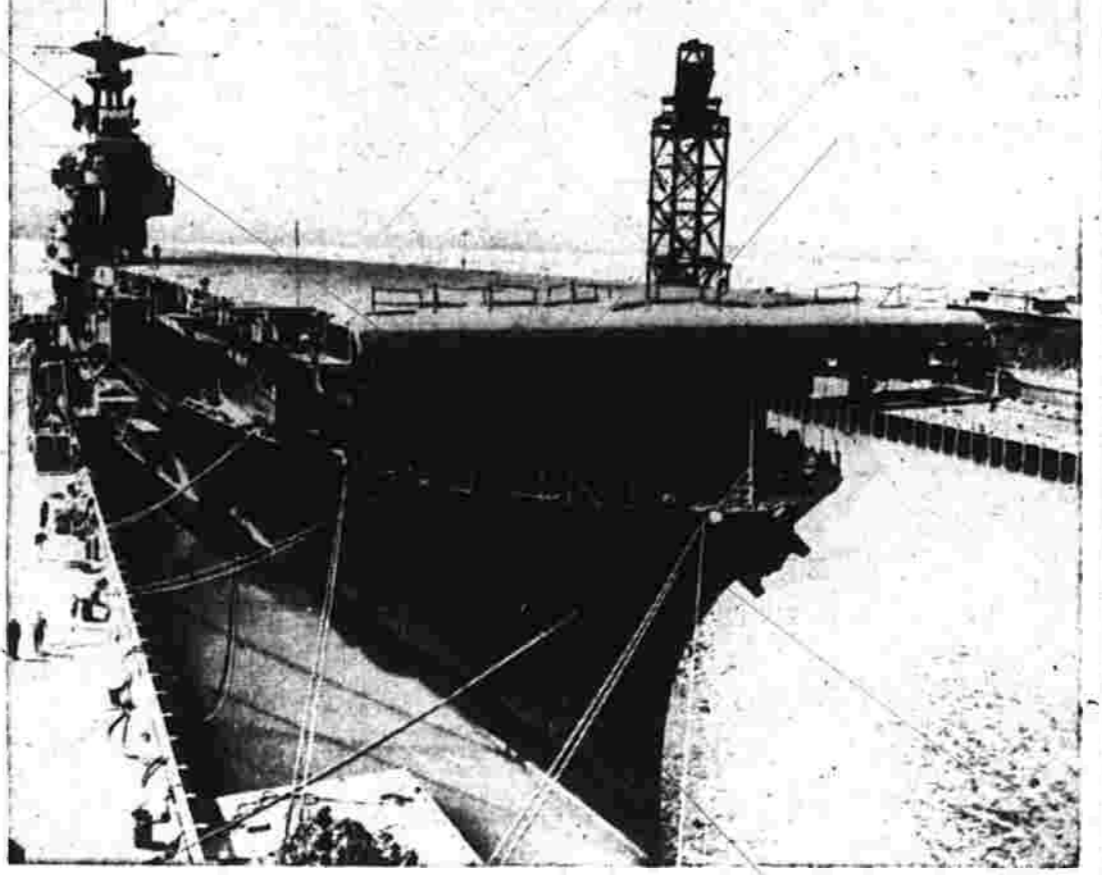

Nazi Losses Approach 4,000,000; Stand Expected in Donets Valley

Battered Units of Timoshenko and Buldenny Bolstered with Reinforcements from East.

Berlin, Oct. 20.—(AP)—Battered units of the fighting forces of Marshals Timoshenko and Buldenny, bolstered with fresh reinforcements from the east, are expected to make a stand in the Donets valley in a desperate effort to stem the German advance into that center of Russian war industry, a military spokesman said tonight.

The high command said German troops with their Italian, Hungarian and Slovak allies, were pressing toward the Donets basin with renewed force and stood within 30 miles of Rostov, gateway to the stretch Caucasus.

New Encirclement Started

The spokesman said a vast new encirclement already had been started by the Germans to meet a new Donets stand.

Germany has now won the eastern campaign economically as well as militarily, this spokesman said. Sixty per cent of Russian iron and steel production is in German hands, he said, and 75 per cent of the bauxite, 70 to 80 per cent of the oil.

Youth Admits Girl's Murder

Woodward Enters Plea Of Guilty in Slaying Of Constance Shipp.

Cambridge, Mass., Oct. 20.—(AP)—Sixteen-year-old Raymond J. Woodward, Jr., pleaded guilty today to murder in the first degree in the mutilation-slaying of his 16-year-old schoolmate and neighbor, Constance Shipp, of Reading, a Boston suburb, last July.

The youth, who passed his 16th birthday in jail while awaiting trial, was one of the youngest Massachusetts defendants ever to face an indictment of this type in this state. Conviction is punishable by death in the electric chair. The plea was accepted by the Superior Court as a jury was said to be chosen from a special panel of 60 men.

Vanished White on Erand

The play-suit clad girl vanished July 25 while on an errand in the center of Reading. Four days later, after an intensive search, her slender and blond-haired body was found in the temporarily-occupied home of a clergyman.

Young Woodward, a slight, sad-faced boy, stood in the prisoners' cage and admitted his guilt in a clear, calm voice.

He wore a striped serge suit and gray sweater.

Attorney Joseph P. Donohue of Lowell, appointed by the court to defend him, said he had advised against Woodward's plea, but added that the youth was acting with the advice and approval of his parents.

Hull Sees Torpedoing Effort to Rule Seas; Vote Closed Hearings

Opponents Cry Gag Rule As Senate Foreign Relations Committee Makes Decision, 12 to 9; Vote to Conclude Sessions at 5 p. m. Friday on Ship Arming Hornet Bill; To Hear Hull.

Washington, Oct. 20.—(AP)—With opponents crying "gag rule," the Senate Foreign Relations Committee voted 12 to 9 today to hold closed hearings, beginning tomorrow, on the House-approved ship arming bill. The committee voted to conclude the hearings at 5 p. m. Friday. He said that Secretary of State Hull probably would be the first witness.

Asserting that the procedure was "a gag rule," Senator La Follette (Iowa, D.), told reporters that opponents of the legislation had denied a right to present all of the witnesses they wished to be heard because of the time limitation.

Won't Be Bound to Secrecy

Senator Clark (D. Mo.) said he had served notice in the meeting he would not be bound by any rule of secrecy and would be free to discuss publicly the testimony that was given behind closed doors.

The 12 to 9 vote came as a motion by Senator Glass (D. Va.) for closed hearings.

Favoring the motion were Senators Connally (D. N.Y.), Thomas (D. Idaho), Murray (D. Mont.), Wagner (D. Pa.), Green (D. R.I.), Harbo (D. N.Y.), Guffey (D. Pa.), Glass, Lee (D. Okla.) and Tamm (D. Del.). George and Wagner were absent, but voted by proxy.

Opposed were Senators Gillette (D. Iowa), Clark (D. Mo.), Johnson (R. Calif.), Capper (R. Kan.), Follette, Vandenberg (R. Mich.), White (R. Mo.), Shippard (R. Minn.) and Nye (R. N.D.).

Subsequently, Clark moved that since the hearings were closed, the committee vote this down, 14 to 7, with White and Gillette shifting to the majority.

"Not Worth Having"

Obviously angered by the committee's decision, Clark commented that he would do nothing like that if it were not worth having.

Berlin, Oct. 20.—(AP)—Authorized German sources expressed strong resentment today of Assistant Secretary of State Brodwin's remarks on alleged German intentions toward Italy and said it was a low down trick to intimate that Germany and Italy ever could be separate.

(LONG, former United States ambassador to Italy, said in a speech Sunday at Detroit that he doubted the people in Italy are wondering whether the call to take their soldiers out of Italy and send them to different parts of Europe was not meant that they will be come another Russia once such an attack is made easier by the removal of a million Italian soldiers from their homeland.)

United Pacific Front Against Japan Formed

Britain, United States, China, Dutch East Indies, Australia and New Zealand in Accord

Sydney, Australia, Oct. 20.—(AP)—Completion of negotiations for a united Pacific front composed of Britain, the United States, China, the Netherlands East Indies, Australia and New Zealand was reported today in Canberra.

Australian Prime Minister John Curtin said the degree of cooperation between the participants would be substantial, and at the same time reiterated a warning that possible extension of the war in the Far East constitutes a serious menace.

No Change in Situation

Curtin declared, however, there had been no change in the situation in the Pacific and said he understood that discussions between Japan and the United States looking toward a settlement of their differences would be continued.

Three Virginia Youngsters Scheduled Tentatively to Face Court.

Bel Air, Md., Oct. 20.—(AP)—Three Virginia youngsters, charged with the slaying of Gainer G. Rowning, 40-year-old Mr. Oliver C. Carpenter, were scheduled tentatively for a preliminary hearing tomorrow before Magistrate Stanley Spencer, but a 24-hour postponement may be sought by defense counsel.

The three are Herbert H. Cox, 15; Leona Ellen Cunningham, 14; and Ida May Price, 15, who are brought to Hartford, Conn., yesterday from Portland, Me., where they were arrested, after being Maryland in Browning's automobile.

The boy was described by his father, Herbert H. Cox of Alexandria, Va., today as a quiet youth, who "never had been in any trouble."

"My son had never attended school nor gone around like other boys and because of our religious views we kept him away from such contacts," Cox said. "We think now maybe we were wrong in protecting him too rigidly; it might have been better had he known more about life."

Parents of the three youngsters are here Sunday and were permitted to visit them in the jail. The three are questioned during that time by State Attorney D. Paul Mohr of Hartford county.

Browning's body was found Sunday in a thicket near Combs, a bullet wound in the head.

Supreme Court Denies Action on Decision Upholding Commission.

Washington, Oct. 20.—(AP)—The Supreme Court refused today to review a decision upholding a Federal Trade Commission order directing the Ford Motor Company to stop alleged "misleading" advertising concerning a "six per cent" plan for financing the purchase of automobiles.

Challenging the 1938 order, the company contended the financing plan was "identical in principle" with the system employed by the Federal Housing Administration and the Electric Home and Appliance Authority.

Ford sought a Supreme Court review of a decision by the Sixth Federal Circuit court upholding the FTC order. The commission opposed a review on the ground that the circuit court ruling was "clearly correct."

British Raid Derails Nazi Arms Train

Fliers-Make Successful Sweep Across Occupied France; Group of Barges Is Set Afire.

London, Oct. 20.—(AP)—The R.A.F. made a successful sweep across occupied France today during which it derailed an ammunition train, the Air Ministry announced. The attack came after dark and destroyed about 45 German trucks loaded with men, fuel and munitions, 25 tanks and 70 cannon.

Brace for Impact
