## Labor

Employment Curves

As pleasure car production lashed, and while machines are being rejiggered so they can make tanks, a lot of automobile workers are going to be out of work. During the week the CIO Automobile Vorkers Union calculated that employment will hit its deepest slump next March or April.

The union and the various manufacturers estimate that unemployent in the industry will reach 175. 000 to 200,000 at its worst. (Last year 500,000 men were at work on e average.) Already plans are beng made to spread out the work and tect men's seniority.

Many a town besides Detroit is feeling unemployment — or the threat of it—because its industries re not vital to rearmament. Tuesday an OPM official told a Senate ommittee that seven communities, rom Wisconsin to Georgia, faced severe unemployment unless some kind of defense manufacturing could be steered their way.

Strife And Strikes
