Cravda Declares German Advance Not Halted; Moscow, Donets Basin, Crimea and Rostov in Great Peril; Says Hitler's Hopes for Victory Before Winter Collapse; Little Change.

Moscow, Oct. 29.—(AP)—Cravda, organ of the Communist party, declared today that the advance of powerful German armies has not yet been halted, that Moscow, the Donets basin, the Crimea and Rostov are in great danger, but said Hitler's hopes for victory before winter had collapsed. The Pravda editorial, broadcast by Tass, said the German high command had hurried in the battle against Russia, and lost its entire land army, artillery and tanks, and nine-tenths of its Air Force, as well as the riches of Germany's "vassals."

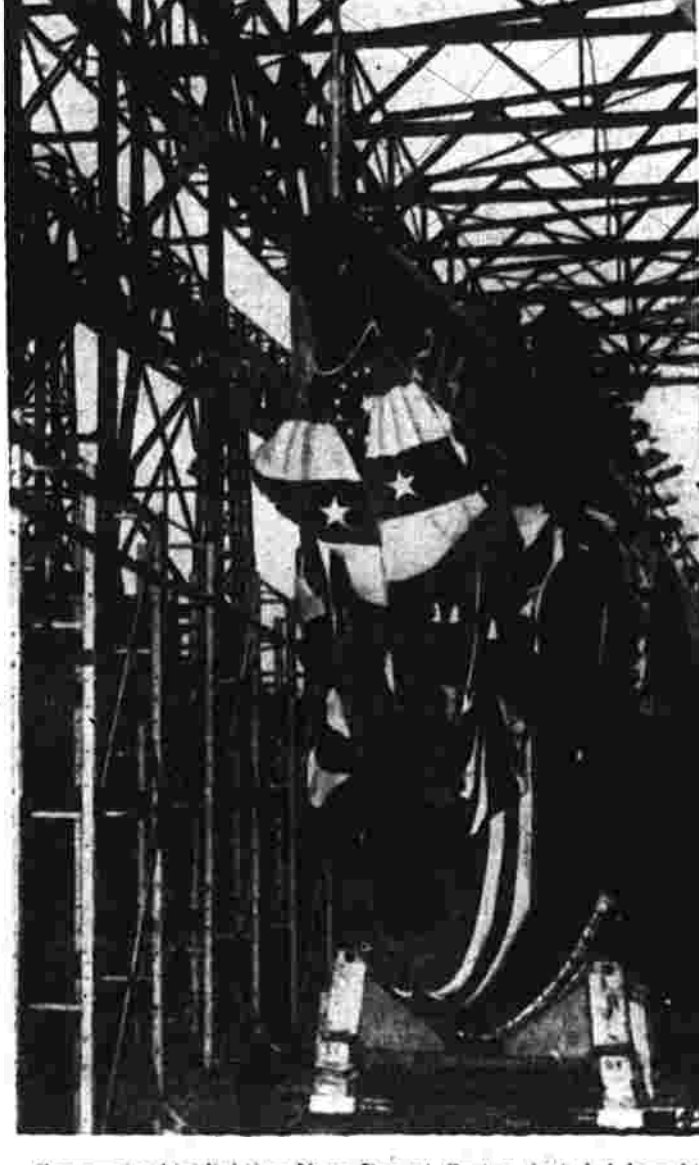

Put Country Above Self

Gov. Hurley Urges Citizens of State to Make "All Out" Effort.

Hartford, Oct. 29 — Governor Hurley today called upon the people of Connecticut to put "Country above self" in a special message printed in Civilian Defense News, a publication of the State Defense Council. "Businessman, housewife, worker, professional, each has a part to play in the task ahead," the message says pointing out that "normal conditions" and "business as usual" of necessity are in suspension for the duration.

"Country above self" — Governor Hurley says. "That is the rule we Americans must live by if we are to achieve successfully the goals of our national policy, if we are to be healthy enough and strong enough to build the way to victory."

"We must realize, at last, the war for ourselves and for the world. To preserve the free way of life, we have entered a period of total defense to prepare ourselves against possible attack and to produce the forces fighting against aggression enough of the weapons of war to defeat the power of out-laws."

"Businessman, housewife, worker, professional, each has a part to play in the task ahead, each

has a service to give to our country. Businessmen must understand that "normal conditions" and "business as usual" of necessity are in suspension for the duration. They must understand that victory is not easily bought. They must understand that they are in a great battle of production against the combined capacities of all the Axis Powers. "Country above self" for businessmen means the gallant acceptance of priorities restrictions and of the temporary obligations created by the emergency. And beyond that it means that businessmen must join the Civilian Defense forces in whatever capacity required. This means a curtailment of leisure time and of social pleasures. It means that they must become air raid wardens and voluntary firemen.

"Housewives must face the fact—sacrificed, in increasing amounts, to the needs of defense production commodity prices will rise. The dangers from without will be felt in every American home. But the spirit of America, the inviolable devotion to freedom and liberty, must be kept alive and growing, and the must be done in the homes. And housewives too must find the time to join and cooperate with the numerous voluntary civilian defense agencies to be trained and to help prepare for any emergency."

"Country Above Self" — "Country above self" for workers, men and women must be expressed in a genuine desire to maintain industrial peace, to toil and sweat and sacrifice in the way of production and for them, too

when time is available, to serve with local Defense Councils in any of the numerous civilian defense activities.

"Professionals — teachers, lawyers, doctors, engineers — all have a part to play in defense preparations. In speaking for and demonstrating unity, in helping to fortify the American spirit.

"Every citizen, of every walk of life, of every calling, of every race and creed must become a voluntary overtime worker in America's national defense program.

"Country above self is the rule we must live by. The test of good citizenship is the ability and willingness we show to follow that rule."
