

Japanese Sending Envoy to Hasten Washington Talks

Kurusu Taking Trans-Pacific Clipper in Effort To Reach Accord with United States in View Of Very Serious Situation Prevailing

Tokyo, Nov. 5.—(AP)—The Japanese government announced today that it was sending Saburo Kurusu, former ambassador to Germany, to Washington by trans-Pacific clipper in an effort to reach an accord with the United States "in view of the very serious situation prevailing."

Arrangements for Kurusu's trans-Pacific flight were made in Washington last night by American Secretary of State Cordell Hull, resulting in a two-day delay of Kurusu's departure from Hong Kong to make Kurusu catch a government spokesman.

Leaves Tokyo by Plane

The special envoy already is en route, having left Tokyo by plane yesterday.

The government spokesman said Kurusu's mission was to facilitate a United States-Japanese understanding through the talks which have been in progress in Washington since late August.

Domei, news agency with close official connections, said Kurusu would second the efforts of Ambassador Admiral Kichiburo Nomura to explain the Japanese situation to United States leaders, including President Roosevelt.

Seven-Point Program

Nevertheless the departure of the envoy, whose title is special adviser to Ambassador Nomura, coincided with publication in the Japan Times and Advertiser, Foreign Office organ, of a seven-point program which it said the United States must accept if a record is to be reached.

In effect this called on America to withdraw her influence from the Orient, recognize Japan's military, economic and diplomatic superiority of the past ten years and approve her "new order" in Greater East Asia.

Same Paper Returned to Attack

The same paper, returning to the attack with an editorial in its afternoon edition, urged the United States to sacrifice the "Chungking government of China to ensure peace and to compare differences with Japan before turning her full attention to her feud with Germany.

Not as Irrevocably Committed

"This is within America's reach," the paper said, "because it is not as irrevocably committed to support of Chungking as to fortify Young Britain."

Washington, Nov. 5.—(AP)—Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau and congressional tax leaders conferred today with a view to starting a huge new tax bill through Congress before the first of the year.

Charles Doughton (D., N.C.), of the House Ways and Means committee and Chairman George (D., Ga.), of the Senate Finance Committee said after the meeting, however, no decisions have been reached yet.

Future Food Prices At the Cross-Roads

May Be Determined in Control Measures Now Before Congress; Opinion of Baruch.

By Paul Geener and John Beckley New York, Nov. 5.—How much will it cost to fill the family market basket this winter, next spring, in 1942, in 1943?

Future food prices throughout the duration of the defense emergency may be the outcome as Congress deliberates over price control.

Price control, particularly with regard to farm products, is occupying the center of the stage. Wall Street discussions this week are based on the fact that the government will set up a price control board to regulate the market.
