

Seeking to Clinch Senate Approval Of Arming Ships

Administration Lieutenants Predict House Will Follow Action, Send Measure to Roosevelt For Signature Before End of Next Week.

Washington, Nov. 8.—(AP)—The congressional leadership sought today to clinch the Senate's approval of neutrality revision by winning prompt House passage of the legislation to arm American merchant ships and allow them to sail to any port in the world.

After 11 days of strenuous debate, a House and Senate bill passed 50 to 37 in the House and 67 to 27 in the Senate.

The arguments grew acrimonious during yesterday's 10 hours of debate, but there were exchanges of compliments between opposing leaders at the end of the session.

The bill on passage was completed at 9:22 p. m. (east.) after the administration argued for the legislation and 15 Democrats, 21 Republicans and one progressive Democrat voted against.

Supporters of the president's foreign policy bowed over, one after another, opposition attempts to limit the measure to ship arming, to arm ships and permit them to enter any belligerent ports not surrounded by combat zones, to repeal the law completely.

The House originally passed legislation limited to lifting the neutrality act prohibition against placing guns on merchant ships.

The broader Senate measure, allowing armed ships to enter non-forbidden belligerent ports and combat areas, thus must be considered by the House.

House debate was set to start Wednesday and although the rules in that chamber would permit the leadership to limit debate to an hour it was indicated that at least one or two full days' discussion would be required.

Bloom Predicts Approval Chairman Bloom (D-N.Y.) of the House Foreign Affairs committee predicted to reporters the House would approve the Senate measure by a majority of from 75 to 100.

Some more conservative administration members expressed their opposition to the measure.

"To Expise Connection" On the House side, Representative (D-Wash.) a leader of the so-called liberal bloc, said that group expected to "expise the connection between dollar-a-year men and their defense contracts."

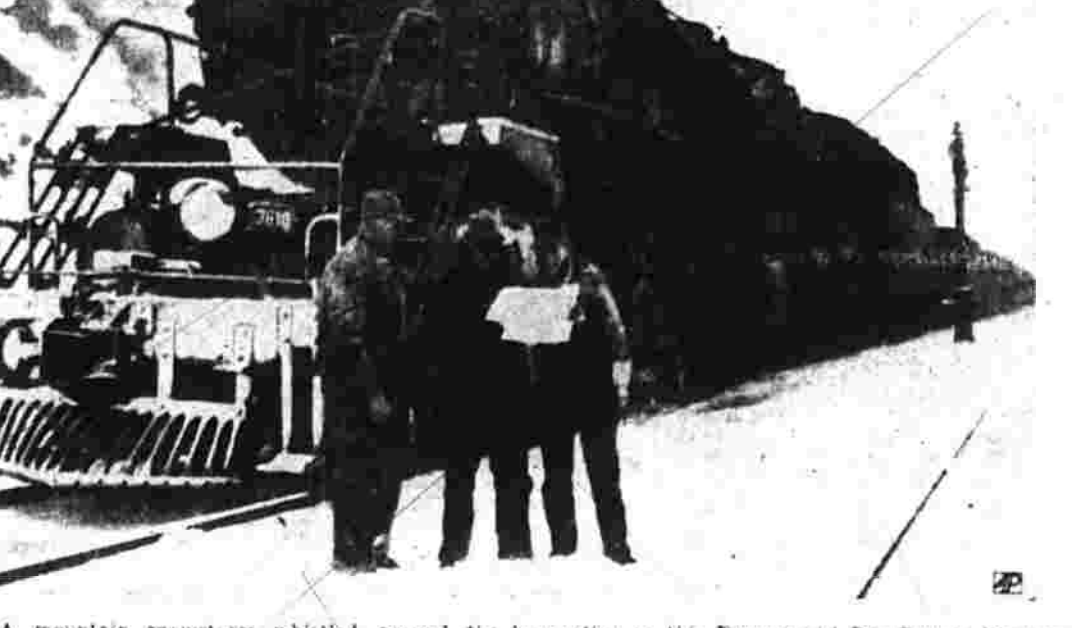

London, Nov. 8.—(AP)—The German high command announced today that the Nazi Army in the Crimea had broken through a Russian defensive zone about six miles deep on the narrow peninsula leading to Kerch and toward the extreme eastern edge of the peninsula.

The high command made no mention of operations around the big Crimean naval base of Sevastopol on the southern coast where German troops previously had been reported hammering at strong Russian fortified positions.

The war bulletin declared, however, that the Nazi Air Force was continuing to blast at transport ships in the Black Sea and to have assembled off the Crimean coast to facilitate a possible port withdrawal.

Nazi dive-bombers were reported with striking accuracy to have port off Yalta, midway between Sevastopol and Kerch, and a Russian submarine was said to have sunk another transport of 12,000 tons in the Black Sea.

The war bulletin omitted mention of military operations in the Donets basin, the central front before Moscow or in the Leningrad area in the north.

DNB, the official news agency, however, reported that yesterday the German push on the middle command acknowledged had struck at many places in Germany against strong Russian resistance.

Moscow's Defenders Halt Attack on City; Smash Defense Zone

Reply Seen On British Policy Soon

Churchill Is Expected to Give Answer in Commons Posed by Agitation

London, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Moscow's defenders announced triumphantly today that they had halted the German attack on the city.

The general statement coincided with other reports telling of counter-attacks on some sectors with strong tank forces which the Germans were attempting to break with flame-throwers.

On other sectors of the front before the capital the Germans were reported to be offensive and the Berlin radio stated that considerable ground had been won by the invaders near Moscow yesterday.

Food Prices Seen Rising High Enough

Nelson Tells Grocers Inflation Not Going to Be Allowed to Happen; Cooperation Pledged.

New York, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Donald M. Nelson, executive director of the Supply, Priorities and Allocations Board, says food prices already have gone about as high as they properly should.

When the national defense program began, Nelson told the Associated Grocers' Manufacturers last night, food prices were at a "profit level."

"To be safe," he braced "no simple must not have a special in food prices. Inflation is not going to be allowed to happen."

Wares Against Inflation Nelson declared the nation did not have sufficient supplies of essential materials to permit the building of any new food processing equipment that was not "vitally needed," and he warned against the possibility that American industry would have a profitable year.

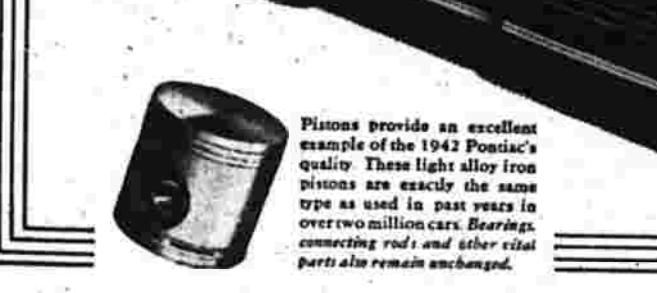

In Too Deep To Get Out?

SOMETIMES a man goes so far he cannot turn back. As Adolf Hitler split the Russian Crimea at the top of the "mount" for a tactical reason, a London military observer forecast that the Nazi Fuehrer would be forced to push his war-weary troops on towards the Caucasus—even if it meant dealing with General Sir Archibald Wavell's fresh Indian army.

It is almost certain, this observer said, that Hitler needs Caucasus oil and food products so badly that he will risk pinning a battle of empire immediately.

Another Du? herque? The Russian effort to stem the German sweep through the Crimea, but had merely fought rear-guard actions while retreating to previously prepared positions to disperse Sevastopol, their main Black Sea naval base, and the eastern Crimean port of Kerch. The Germans apparently hoped to make Sevastopol another Dunkerque, but even some Berlin observers pointed out that Olega, another Black Sea port, had held out for a week. The Germans claimed most of their army got out of Odessa by sea.

Retreat from Sevastopol would be dangerous, the ships peppered with stuka bombs. From Kerch it is only 215 miles across a strait to the Caucasus. This also is the route the Germans would take if they pushed ahead and tried to join their army fighting in the Donets basin. However, commentator Edward Sevastopol pointed out that the Nazis must reckon with Russia's remaining sea power... a score or so surface warships and more numerous submarines.

A Birthday Under Fire Battling Moscow, meanwhile, celebrated Soviet Russia's 24th birthday by publishing slogans such as "Long live the U. S. A., which supports the Soviet Union." Indications were being given that the Nazis were digging in for a winter on the central front. Stalin, in a rare speech, indirectly appealed to Germany to carry the war to Germany, which was fighting alone and was handicapped by the lack of a second front in Europe. He set Germany's total casualties at 4,000,000.

Germany announced she had sunk only 441,200 tons of British shipping (plus that known up to the date) in October, compared with 683,000 tons in September. There was no explanation of the decrease. The British said they had rescued 1,276 officers and men from sunken German submarines but didn't say how many U-boats were involved. The Germans said they had sunk 112 British destroyers to date; the British, about 57.

The Death Roll A summary made public in Berlin last week showed that at least 1,082 persons had been executed for defying the Nazis since Germany's war with Russia began June 22. In addition, the press from time to time had mentioned "several" victims of the one-way trip, and reports continued to come in during the week. One said that 139 allied Communists and Jews had been shot in Belgrade for attacks on two soldiers.

The Bread Line A famine in Lyons, France, questioned doctors in four leading cities of Unoccupied France. This is what the French, especially manual laborers and children, are losing their job for lack of normal food supplies; that colds and lung troubles are increasing. That most Frenchmen have to sleep two hours longer to make up for short rations. Dave Chambers, chairman of the Board of Selectmen, believes that the town has a real claim for \$30,000 from the State Highway department, and he intends to keep in the pressing for the same or at least a credit from the department in that amount. Remember, the town got \$1 Federal grant for the East Center street boulevard project amounting to about \$70,000, and then the State Highway department entered the picture as sponsoring agency. Something is done about it. That \$20,000 could do a lot of good money as a highway work for Manchester.

Mayor Chambers hinted to the other day that if he had succeeded in getting the \$20,000 from that grant he would have dropped out as a Selectman candidate. If it comes during this year he won't be a candidate next year, he says.
