Unless some entirely unexpected circumstance intervenes, the new bridge across the Connecticut River at Hartford will be opened for traffic on July 1, 1942, Attorney Raymond A. Johnson of this city, a member of the bridge committee, told the Kiwanis club members this noon. Judge Johnson said that it was expected by the commission that stood for the main span will arrive this week, and work will be started immediately following its arrival.

In reviewing the work that was necessary in finally getting state approval for the project, Judge Johnson said that the project was largely handled by the State Highway department. The steel work has all been ordered and there should be no hold-up in the delivery. The main span, extending 300 feet, will be one of the longest single spans in the country.

Under Federal law the cost of the bridge must be cleared within 24 hours. To meet this a toll schedule has been set up that should meet the cost of the project in 25 years if traffic is as great as the survey indicated it would be.

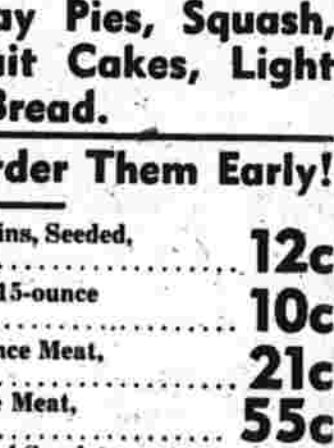
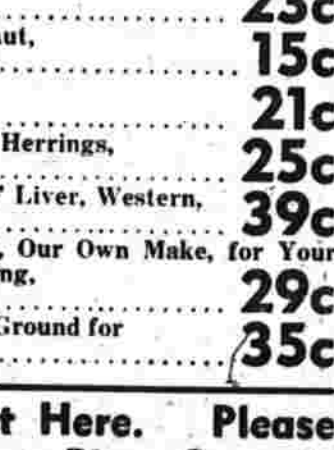
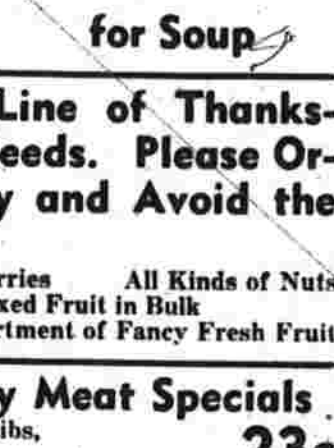
