King John IV Restored Portuguese Monarchy

THE turn of the 20th century marked the downfall of many opinion of most of the plain peo-ple, it was good riddance. revolution of 1910 expelled Al-fonso and the royal family for all time, the ascendency of the mon-archial line in 1640 is still cele-The stamp above, issued in 1940

to commemorate the 300th anniversary of the restoration of the monarchy, bears a likeness of King John IV, Duke of Braganza. As leader of the patriotic party, the Duke succeeded in 1640 in ex-pelling the Spanish usurpers and making himself king, after the country had been 60 years under the yoke of Spain. The cortes ratified John as king in 1641 and he ruled for 15 years, restoring the finances and promot-ing commerce and agriculture, no easy task after home rule had been absent for six decades. In 1644 the Spaniards were


