Connally Proposes Repeal of Guffey Act by Congress

Urges Action If Miners Decline to End Walk-out; Policy Committee Meets to Frame Formal Reply to Roosevelt's Peace Proposal.

Washington, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Senator Connally (D., Tex.) proposed today that Congress repeal the Guffey coal act if CIO miners decline to end the strike which has tied up production in most of the steel companies' captive coal mines and has spread with recurring violence to numerous commercial shafts. The policy committee of the United Mine Workers assembled here for a forenoon meeting to frame a formal reply to President Roosevelt's most recent peace proposal. That the union ship issue which brought on the strike be held in abeyance for the emergency or be submitted to arbitration.

Change School Transport Law

Manchester Boys May Now Take Courses at Other Trade Schools.

Under changed regulations governing transportation to the trade schools, Manchester boys may this year attend trade schools in Hartford, Meriden, Middletown, New Britain and Willimantic, where courses not given at the local trade school are offered. It was announced today by A. S. Boynton, director of the bureau of vocational education.

Education

Former regulations provided pupil transportation to trade school only when there was no trade school in the town in which the pupil lived.

The new law provides for trade school transportation for a "reasonable distance."

This change in the law enables students to attend out-of-town trade schools and to receive instruction in courses which are not offered in the local school.

At the Hartford Trade School courses not offered in Manchester are automobile repair, drafting, architectural, linotype, masonry, painting, paperhanging, plumbing and printing. Manchester boys can also attend classes in automobile repair, ornamental design, printing, silversmithing, toolmaking and sheet metal at Meriden. Middletown also offers a course in automobile repair.

At New Britain Trade School, Manchester boys may enroll in automatic electric, drafting-architectural, linotype, masonry, plumbing, printing and toolmaking. Courses at Willimantic are automobile repair and drafting-architectural. Day classes are in operation from 8 to 12 and 1 to 5.

Further information concerning content of courses and the time at which they are in operation may be obtained from John G. Schmalzer, director of the Manchester Trade School, or directors of the Hartford, Meriden, Middletown, New Britain and Willimantic Trade Schools.
