Ramspeck Is Told To Draw New Bill On Defense Rows

Washington, Nov. 25.—(AP)—The House Labor Committee instructed Representative Ramspeck (D., Ga.), one of its members, today to prepare by Friday a new bill to control defense strikes based on President Roosevelt's recommendations for cooling off periods and compulsory arbitration. Ramspeck himself made the recommendation for quick action and said he has proposed would call for this procedure.

May Be Compulsion
Successive steps of collective bargaining under existing laws, conciliation, mediation and possibly a fourth step of compulsory arbitration.

Ramspeck said he might include in his bill provisions that both sides in a labor dispute must submit to compulsory arbitration as a last resort, with the added stipulation that workers who did not abide by an arbitrator's decision would be deprived of their rights under such labor laws as the Wagner act, relations act, Norris-LaGuardia act.

Present Laws Adequate

Banking Committee Restores Authority in Price Control Bill
Representative Wolcott (R., Mich.), senior minority member of the committee, denounced the provision as "pernicious" and declared it would permit the price administrator to go into the stock exchange and buy or sell stocks. He said he did not see how "any self-respecting member of Congress could vote for it."

Big Tank Battle Begins to Die; Axis Wipes Out British Brigade

London, Nov. 25.—(AP)—A small British patrol made a foray under cover of darkness Sunday night on the Normandy coast of occupied France and withdrew with only one casualty, British say. German forces will not get information they seek to elicit on raid.

Report Patrol Repulsed
The German said the patrol had been "repulsed by German coastal defenses with heavy losses."

The Information Ministry statement said: "The enemy is betraying anxiety about our intentions with regard to the coast of the occupied territory and hopes by making exaggerated claims to elicit information which will be withheld from him."

Iron Girders Are Removed

Workmen in the employ of the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad removed two big heavy iron girders from the bridge over Hilliard street yesterday afternoon. For a time there was a lot of speculation that this might be the first step towards widening the narrow underpass but it was reported that the railroad officials were going to use the girders for another purpose.

The work train, with a heavy crane, removed the girders that

used to hold up the tracks which formerly led to a side track, connecting with the freight yards. This was demolished some years ago and since the Bon Ami has installed a side track to its own freight sheds, the tracks had been taken up. The old siding was used to unload coal, principally for the Edward Griswold coal yards, and later for unloading oil to a large tank storage plant. Just where the girders were going no one in authority could state. It required about two hours to remove them.
