

Japanese Envoys Will Meet Roosevelt, Hull On Issues in Pacific

Special Importance Attached to Session at White House in View of Announcement of Basic Proposals for Adjusting Problems Had Been Handed to Nomura and Kurusu.

Washington, Nov. 27.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, Secretary of State Hull and Japanese envoys will meet this afternoon in an aftermath of Hull's step last night, putting the issue of peace or war in the Pacific squarely up to the Japanese government. Special importance was attached to the White House meeting in view of the State Department announcement that basic American proposals for adjusting long-standing problems with Japan had been handed Admiral Kichisaburo Nomura, Japanese ambassador, and Saburo Kurusu, the special Japanese envoy.

No details as to reasons underlying today's conference. Reports reaching authoritative Washington quarters indicate that Japan has been rapidly strengthening her forces in French Indo-China within the past week. The reports mentioned not only large troop transports into northern and southern Indo-China but also large shipments of war materials of all kinds including aviation gasoline.

Some of the reports held out a possibility of a Japanese thrust, perhaps into Thailand, within the next few days.

Alternative Now Clear
In the State Department's eyes the alternative now is clear. It was for Japan to accept or reject the formula of basic principles which the United States considered essential to the maintenance of peace and security in the Far East.

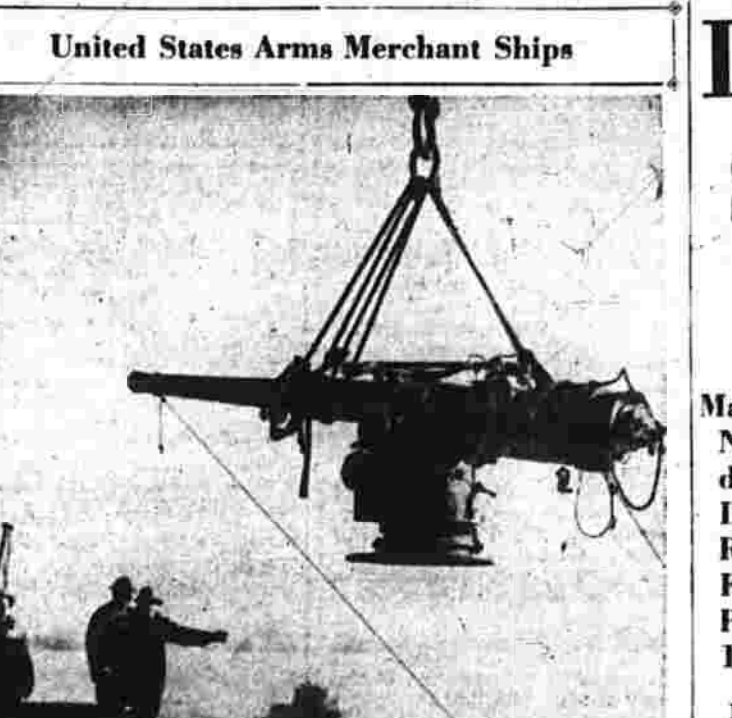

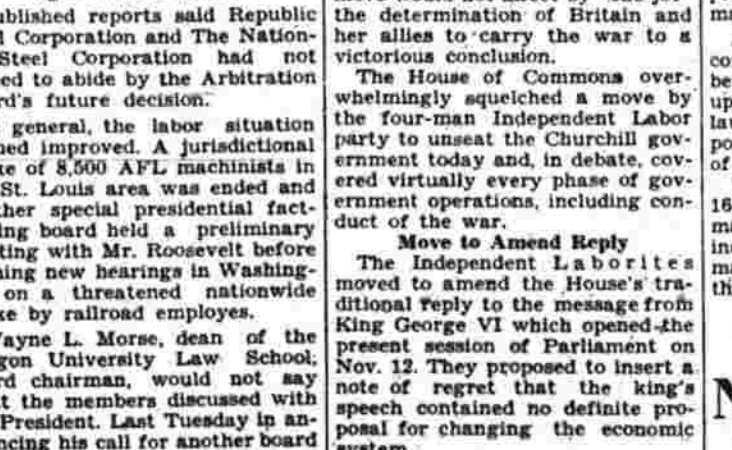

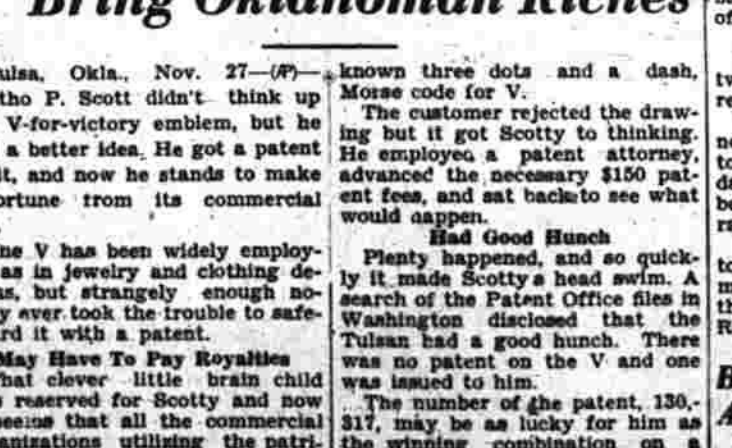
United States Arms Merchant Ships
