Retreat at Rostov Called Big Reversal; British Drive West

Admit German Infantry and Tanks Have Broken into Defenses At Rezegh; Axis Thrust From West Repulsed And Half of Remaining Italian Tanks Destroyed in Attack.

Cairo, Egypt, Dec. 1.—(AP)—British forces which have driven westward beyond the hump of Libya are continuing their operations. British headquarters said today, but it acknowledged that German infantry and tanks have broken into the defenses of Rezegh. In that main sector of the 15-day-old desert struggle, the communiqué said, one Axis tank thrust from the west was repulsed south of Rezegh and the fish armored units, turning on Italy's Ariete—"Spearhead"—division "destroyed about half the remaining tanks of this formation which then fled northwest pursued by British mobile columns."

Reports Reaching Coast.—The British reported yesterday reaching the Mediterranean coast along the Gulf of Sirte, between Bengasi and Ajdabiya, more than 200 miles west from the Egyptian frontier and across the main supply road from Tripoli.

On that and the report that Imperial forces are backing down German-Italian strength in well-defined fighting areas. British officers confidently predicted final destruction of Axis remnants in the Tobruk sector in three days.

There was no indication of the magnitude or success of the German penetration into British defenses around Rezegh. The communiqué said only that it was accomplished yesterday afternoon by the German infantry with tank support and that "further fighting continued in this area."

Heavy Pressure from West.—A British spokesman said the pressure on Britain's corridor to Tobruk was heaviest from the west (that is, on the outside of the British ring on that front); this may have been the Axis thrust from up more reserves from its rear.

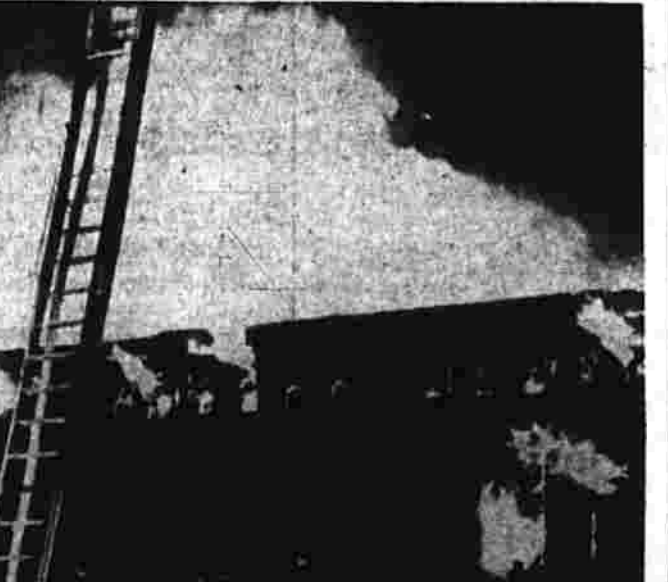
Expulsion of the Italian division, however, was said to have forced a gap between the two German forces for which it was a connection. The Nazi divisions now apparently are trying to reunite through the Rezegh-Tobruk corridor, the spokesman said.

The British since have counter-attacked and "our position is re-established once more," an authoritative source declared in London on the basis of information he said was later than that in the Cairo communiqué.

(This informant said the Nazi infantry apparently slipped through the front in trucks from the east—the direction of the Egyptian frontier—about three days ago and was supposed to be attacked by the German 15th armored division.)

(An authoritative source in London said Ed Duda, in the Rezegh sector, was taken by the Axis Thursday night but the British "brought the enemy out again" in a counter-attack the same night.)

One Dead, Eight Missing in Hotel Blaze

Four Attendants Held Responsible In Hoyt's Death

Coroner Says 'Harmless Patient' at Fairfield State Hospital Victim Beaten to Death Because He Did Not Keep Clothes Clean.

Bridgeport, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Coroner Theodore E. Steiber today held four attendants at the Fairfield State hospital criminally responsible for the death of a "harmless patient" who, he said, was "viciously beaten" because he did not keep his bed and clothing clean.

The patient, Herbert Hoyt, 41, of Stamford, died Nov. 21, and the coroner said an autopsy showed that organs had been ruptured by "vicious blows aimed upon his abdomen."

Named by Coroner Steiber as responsible for the patient's death was John Corcoran, 51, of 1641 State street, New Haven; Wesley Keller, 36, of 101 Walter street, Hagerstown, N. J.; Roy Parsa, 43, of Washington, D. C.; and John Dowling, 41, of Stamford. Corcoran was mentioned by the coroner as the "most vicious" of the attendants involved.

All four accused are being held in the county jail on charges of manslaughter, as are also two other attendants, Thomas Kelly, 54, of Denver, Col., charged with attacking another patient, and Robert Tompkins, 18, of New York, who is said to have manhandled a third patient. Kelly and Tompkins are accused of assault, and the latter recently was released in bonds of \$1,000.

Hull Resumes Talks With Japs' Envoys; Togo Gives Report

Cabinet Decides to Continue Negotiations Despite Great Differences in Viewpoints of Two Governments; Reach Understanding.

Tokyo, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Domei said today the Japanese cabinet had decided to continue negotiations with the United States despite great differences in the viewpoints of the two governments. The news agency reported the decision after a special cabinet session at which Foreign Minister Shigenori Togo outlined the progress of talks which have been under way in Washington.

"Great Difference in Views"—Togo's statement, Domei said, made it clear that there is a "great difference in views between Japan and America," but it added: "However, Japan probably will redouble efforts to make the United States reconsider Pacific problems by continuing negotiations. The ministers met for an hour and there was a general exchange of views among them after the foreign minister's report."

Only last night, Togo, speaking at a banquet marking the first anniversary of the Japanese-Manchukuo-Nanking alliance, declared that the Washington negotiations had taken a most serious turn. "Togo, in his address, reiterated repeated assertions that the United States failed to understand the real situation in East Asia" where, he said, Japan is trying to construct a new order.

Board Calls Recess In Railway Dispute

Chairman Not as Hopeful of Finding Way To Settle Threat of Strike Next Week.

Washington, Dec. 1.—(AP)—President Roosevelt's special fact finding board continued sessions today in efforts to mediate the threatened strike of 350,000 railway operating employees. The board members made no comment as they went back together after about a three-hour recess.

There appears no chance of getting any report to the president until late this afternoon or tonight," Morse added. "I think there is still hope of reaching a settlement in another night."

France and Britain Petain Travels To Meet High Nazi Official

Enters Occupied Zone of France with Darlan; Indications Point to Meeting with Hitler.

Vichy, Unoccupied France, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Marshal Petain and Vice-Premier Darlan entered the occupied zone of France today on a fateful journey which authorized sources said was comparable to the marshal's trip 13 months ago. Montoire, where he and Adolf Hitler agreed on a policy of collaboration.

The police used clubs, fired pistol shots in the air and cut the wires of the public address system.

Babies Contribute Most Toward Population Gain

Washington, Dec. 1.—(AP)—The Census Bureau today announced that babies—God bless 'em—got a nice present received by German-Americans for contributing to the most toward a U. S. population gain of more than a million in 1940.

Blended events in the year ending April 1 were approximately 143,000 more than the average year of the past decade, the bureau said. "Mainly because of this, the nation's estimated population climbed from 131,669,272 on April 1, 1940 to 132,818,055. There were 83,486 more immigrants than emigrants and that helped, too. The population increase during the year was 1,148,783, considerably more than the 898,000 average between 1930 and 1940.

The Census Bureau said that the increase of births over deaths in the 12-month period, the bureau said, was approximately 169,000 more than the 10-year average, 1,471.
