Polish-Soviet Pact Signed

Pledges Not Only Fighting But Also Alliance for Lasting Peace.

Moscow, Dec. 5.—The Free Polish government and the Soviet Union were pledged today not only to fight the war until the German invaders were destroyed, but to promote a "durable" alliance of democratic countries for lasting peace.

A declaration signed last night by Gen. Wladyslaw Sikorski and Joseph Stalin, premier of the Soviet government, asserted that jointly with Great Britain and other allies and with the support of the United States of America, the signatories would "wage war until complete victory."

The pact of friendship and mutual assistance, as published by Tass, declared that after a "victorious war and appropriate punishment of the Hitlerite criminals," there must be restored in Europe "respect for international law backed by the collective armed force of all allied states."

To Fight Hand in Hand The agreement, reached after conversations began Wednesday between the two premiers, provided that Polish troops now in Russia would fight the Germans "hand in hand with Soviet troops."

In a subsequent broadcast address Sikorski promised that while Germany might be able to divert some forces from the eastern front, he was confident that the Polish "suffer inevitable defeat on land, and also in the sea and in the air."

They now talk in Germany of the possibility of defeat, and intimidate people with the threat of military situation, convinced him that the Germans "will soon realize here as well as in London that victory is not their exclusive privilege."

Sikorski, who was guest of honor at a dinner given by Stalin in the Kremlin, described the new agreement as a "turning point for the future of both states," with all past differences forgotten.

The day-long ceremony brought hundreds of persons into this little mountain town, provisional capital of Jefferson. Schools let out early. Streets were jammed with pistol-wielding miners.

Efforts Showing Promise Proponents of the 49th state said their efforts to obtain better roads and proper development of their mineral properties, already were showing promise of bearing fruit.
