Congress Declares War Upon Nipponese; Britain Acts; Japs Claim Naval Victory

Washington's Action Not Awaited; Assert Warships Destroyed

Two Battleships and Aircraft Carrier Claimed To Be Sunk and Six Cruisers Damaged in Principal Results of First Shock of Air-Naval Offensive; Merchant Ships Seized.

Tokyo, Tuesday, Dec. 9.—(Official Radio Picked up by AP)—The Japanese asserted today they had won Naval supremacy over the United States in the Pacific, claiming the destruction of two aircraft carriers and an aircraft carrier and the sinking of six cruisers.

Claim Own Fleet Intact The claim to supremacy appeared in a commentary resume broadcast by Domei, which said that any force the United States might muster would be regarded as utterly inadequate to accomplish any successful outcome in an encounter with the thus far intact Japanese fleet.

Admit Only Two Planes Lost 80 far as Naval losses went, the Japanese said they had escaped unscathed and they acknowledged the loss of only two planes in Philippine actions.

British Push Libya Attack Report Nazis' African Divisions 'Definitely On Defensive' Now.

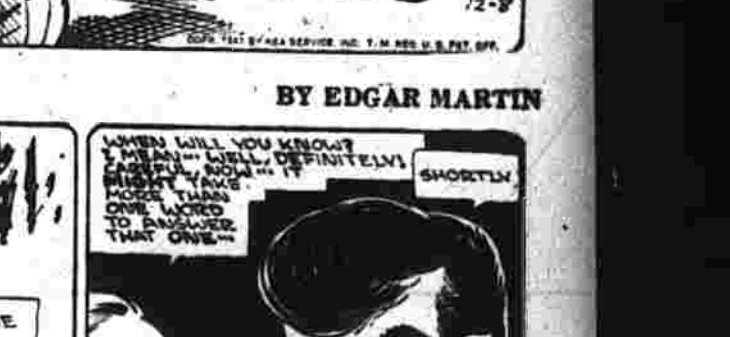
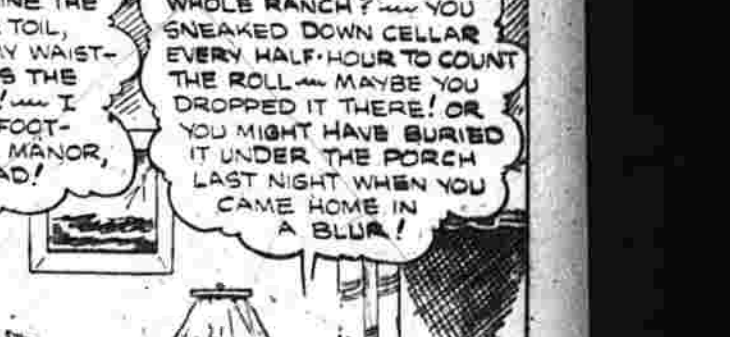
