

Small branches will be invisible, giving the whole tree a shrunken look. Practice will improve the eyes in seeing more and more of the tree.

In the dark laboratory the average eye requires about 30 minutes to reach its full blackout acuity. When that point is reached, the part of the eye which sees best in the dark can discern an object 1000 times fainter than one visible to the portion of the eye which does the detailed daylight seeing. The daylight portion is concen-trated in the center of the retins, the curtain of nerve endings at the back of the eyeball. The concen-tration (called the fovea) is di-rectly on the opposite side from the oupl. It is only about one degree in diameter (one to one-and-a-half millimeters).


