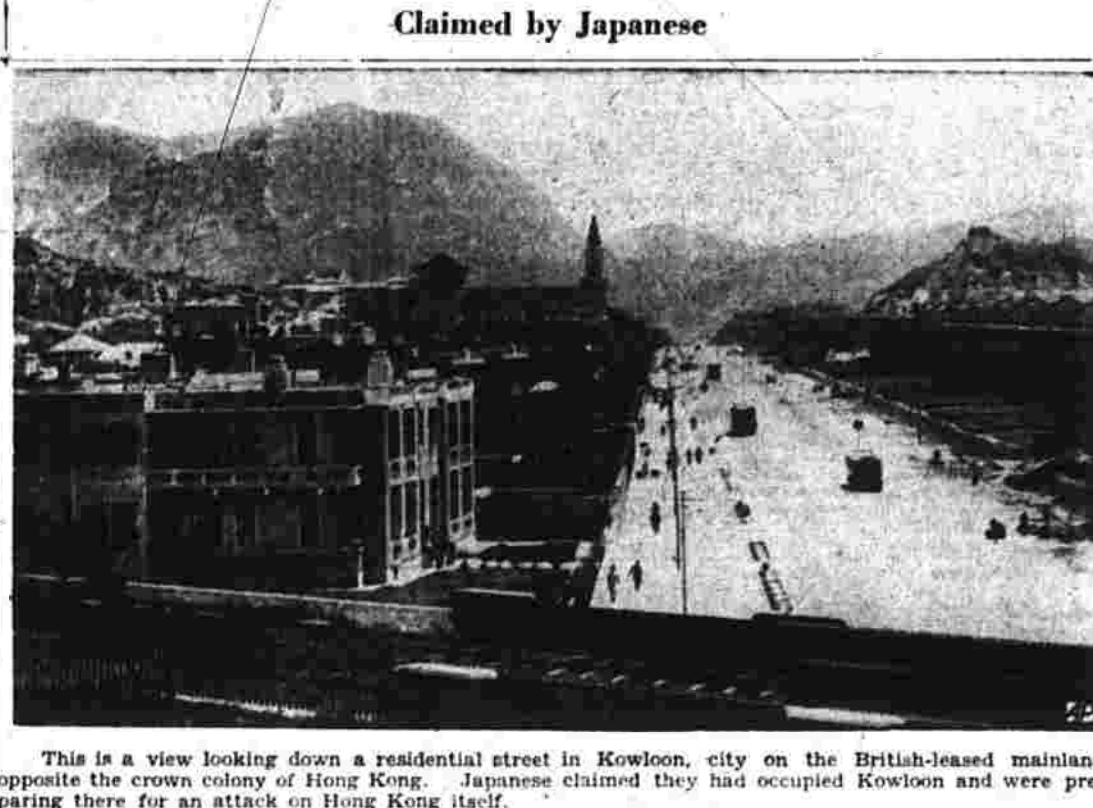

Reaffirmation Urged On Saving Civilization

Hurley and Fisher Issue Joint Statement of Determination to Prevent Destruction

Hartford, Dec. 15.—(AP) In a joint statement issued today Governor Hurley and Defense Administrator Samuel H. Fisher urged that the Christmas celebration be accompanied by a reaffirmation of "our common determination that we shall allow no influence, however powerful, to destroy the civilization we have built."
