Fighting Major Battle North of Manila; Capture of Kuantan Reported by Tokyo

Smashing Air Blows In Drive on Malaya; Singapore Is Raided

Jap Bombers Usher In New Year with Air Attacks; Little Damage To Property and Even Less to Spirits of Thousands Who Celebrate; Battle Continues at Kuantan Yet.

Singapore, Jan. 1.—(AP)—Japanese bombers ushered in the New Year for Singapore with two raids early today which apparently did little damage to property and even less to the spirits of thousands who celebrated at homes and hotels despite the blackout.

Japs Claim Capture (The Japanese Army claimed officially that Kuantan was captured yesterday morning by its troops.)

In the latest raids on Singapore Japanese bombers flew over in formation by moonlight shortly before dawn, and again just after daybreak, dropping salvos of bombs.

A communique said "there were no military casualties and no damage to military objectives."

Shell British Positions Some Japanese shelling of British positions and contact between small parties on the Perak front—in western Malaya—was noted by headquarters.

One of our companies, supported by artillery, inflicted about 100 casualties on the enemy and destroyed a small enemy ammunition dump," its communique said.

Following loss of Kuching to the Japanese invaders, the British reported receipt of information that "the bulk of our troops has been successfully withdrawn from Sarawak (the 'white rajah' kingdom) and are in touch with The Netherlands East Indies forces in west Borneo."

Some damage to military objectives was acknowledged in a Japanese raid Dec. 30 upon Port Swettenham, on the Malayan west coast, and it was said that "slight temporary damage" had been caused.

Fire Destroys River Dredge

Sinks in 20 Feet of Water After Blazing For Five Hours Today.

Hartford, Jan. 1.—(AP)—A spectacular, early morning fire today destroyed the dredge, Lawrence, near the East Hartford Bank of the Connecticut river.

The dredge, which had been working here for some three years clearing the river channel and taking out all material for the dike, broke into towering flames shortly after 4:15 a.m.

Nazi Morale In Occupied Norway Low

London, Jan. 1.—(AP)—The Admiralty announced today that British Commandos have carried out a second raid on the Lofoten Islands off the northern coast of German-held Norway.

This time, said an announcement, the specially trained raiding unit spent several days in the islands, using one harbor as a fueling base.

Desert Fight Shifts To Border of Egypt

South African Troops Capture Several Positions and 600 Prisoners South of Bardia.

Cairo, Jan. 1.—(AP)—The British Middle East command said today that the chief fighting on the North African desert had shifted to the Egyptian border area, where South African troops had captured several positions and 600 prisoners south of Bardia.

Attacking Near Bardia The British troops attacking near Bardia were supported by tank and artillery units, the communique said. A number of German tanks were among the prisoners. British casualties were light.

Tojo Declares Fall of Manila and British Naval Base Only Matter of Time; Domei Reports Japanese So Near Philippine Capital Gunfire Can Be Heard in Its Streets.

Tokyo, Jan. 1.—(Official Broadcast Recorded by AP)—Japanese capture of Kuantan on the east coast of Malaya 160 miles north of Singapore and smashing aerial blows in advance of the Japanese drive down the west coast were reported today by Imperial headquarters.

Without specifying exact troop positions, Domei reported that Japanese attackers on the Philippine island of Luzon were so near Manila that the sounds of gunfire could be heard in the streets of the capital.

An army communique on the operations of Japanese bombers in waters around the Philippines and Malaya since Dec. 28 claimed that a submarine was sunk, two steamers of 3,000 tons each were destroyed and a direct bomb hit was scored on a destroyer.

Most of these aerial attacks were in the Strait of Malacca, between Malaya and the Island of Sumatra. The Japanese said their bombers had hit hard at Singapore in successive raids Monday and Tuesday night as well as at the Klang-Port Swettenham area of the Malaya west coast 250 miles northwest of Singapore.

That Japanese forces beating down the eastern side of the Malay peninsula were in the Kuantan area had been admitted in a communique.

Bomber Crash Fatal to Five

Eyewitnesses Say High Tension Wire Struck Before Plane Explodes

Minneapolis, N. Y., Jan. 1.—(AP)—A twin-engine army bomber crashed into a gravel pit in Garden City park on Long Island today killing five men instantly.

Eyewitnesses said the plane struck a high tension wire half a mile from the pit and exploded twice after striking the ground.

The identity of the dead men was not immediately established. The bodies were not removed from the plane at once.

Britain's Shipping Losses Cut; Axis To Feel Bombings

Nazi Submarine Fleet Hard Hit and Germans Faced with Difficulties Manning U-Boats and Training Crews Adequately.

London, Jan. 1.—(AP)—A sharp cut in shipping losses from German sea and air attacks and indications that the Axis will feel in 1942 the weight of bomb assaults overshadowing the destructive air offensives of 1941 gave Britons new confidence today.

The ministry of Information reported that the German submarine fleet has been hard hit and that the German high command "is faced with difficulties in manning U-boats and adequate training of their crews."

Figures Not Given Figures were not given but the ministry said Britain's shipping losses from air attacks had been cut in recent months to only eight per cent of those early in the year.

Japs' Losses Heavy; Three Isles Shelled; Churchill in Capital

Roosevelt and British Prime Minister Sit in Pew Once Used by Washington; Britain Lays Wreath on Tomb of First President; Stop at Mount Vernon and Lincoln Memorial

Washington, Jan. 1.—(AP)—President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill sat in a church pew once used by George Washington today and heard a young rector pray for "pardon, power and peace," and for America to throw off its "sin of international irresponsibility."

The two leaders in the war against the Axis motored to the 168-year-old Christ church in nearby Alexandria, Va., for the service and then went to Mount Vernon where the British leader laid a wreath of chrysanthemums and iris on the tomb of the first president of the United States.

Brief stops at Washington's home at Mount Vernon and at the marble memorial to Abraham Lincoln in Washington were made on the way back to the White House.

Set Aside for Prayer The first day of this New Year had been set aside by the president as a day of prayer for forgiveness of "our shortcomings of the past" and for "God's help in the days to come."

The Rev. Edward Randolph Wells, 35-year-old rector of Christ church, delivered a ringing sermon to his distinguished visitors.

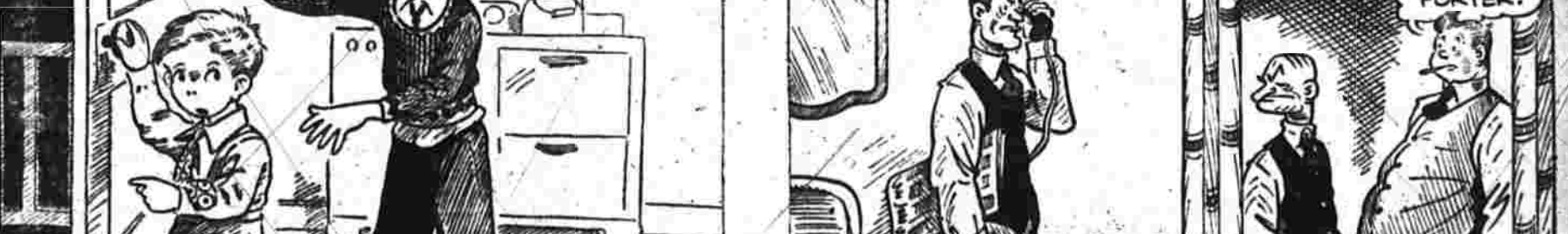
