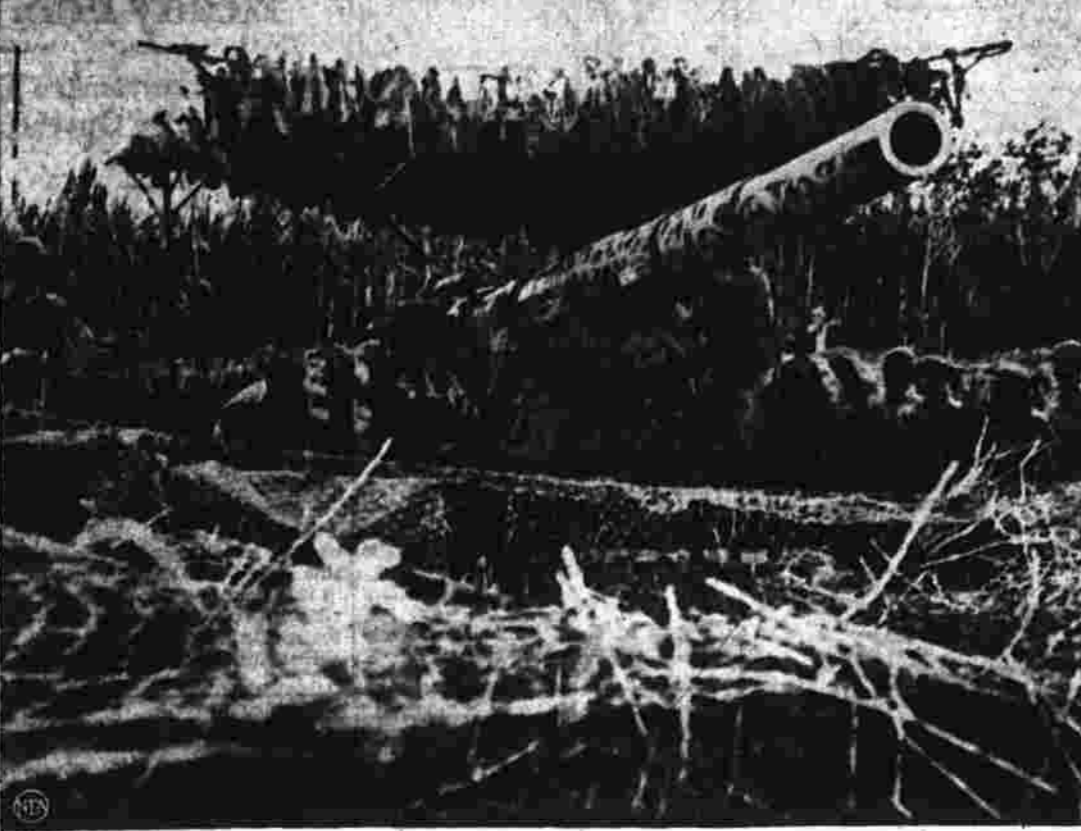

As perhaps you know, iron is a necessary part of the red blood cells. Theoretically, you should get all the iron you need to build healthy red blood cells from the foods you customarily eat.

The reasons lie in the vast improvement in the equipment used for the average freight car.

Now for a partial list of some of the foods which are good sources of iron in the diet.

Answer: Cereals, such as oatmeal, and cereals to youngsters? My children are very fond of them.

There is a great deal of interest in the subject of "food iron" in the part of those wishing to obtain the benefits to be derived from a plentiful supply of this essential mineral in the diet.

And I believe an even greater interest could be created by letting more people know about the uses of iron in the body.

When the diet is poor in iron, a liberal use of the iron-bearing foods for one month should provide you with clear evidence that you are deriving positive benefits.

Moreover, foods rich in iron generally possess other virtues, and are good for the health.
