New Wave of U-Boat Attacks Seen Likely

Naval Warships Continue to Operate Off East Coast; 20 Are Sunk or Damaged.

Washington, Jan. 30.—(AP)—A new wave of U-boat attacks on the Atlantic coast shipping was considered likely today despite the increasing effectiveness of American counter-measures which already have sunk or damaged at least 20 Axis submarines.

The Navy warned that "enemy submarines continue to operate off the east coast of the United States and are reported as far south as Florida" but no new coastal attacks have been announced since the sinking of the Francis E. Powell was disclosed on Wednesday.

German tactics in past submarine campaigns have been to maintain a constant flow of replacements. Following the same system in the present warfare, U-boats from the Atlantic coast will be replaced by those from the Pacific.
